THE following By-Laws for regulating the proceedings of the Guildford Municipal Council, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council.

BY-LAWS unanimously agreed to by the Municipal Council of Guildford at a Meeting held on the 22nd June, 1871.

RESOLVED—That in accordance with the 28th Section of "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871," the following By-Laws be now adopted by the Guildford Town Council, for the regulation, management, and control of the several matters and things therein set forth, viz. :—

1. The Guildford Town Council shall meet in the Mechanics' Hall, for the transaction of business, on the first Thursday in every month, or oftener if necessary.

2. Until the state of the funds will warrant the employment of a Supervisor—the Chairman with the advice of the Council shall have the immediate custody, care, management, and direction, of all Buildings, Lanes, Streets, Paths, Jetties, Wharves, Trees, Plants, Posts, Fences, Works, Drains, Culverts, and other property over which the "Municipal Institutions' Act, 1871," gives them control.

3. The Collector for the time being, appointed by the Council, shall have the necessary legal power and authority to demand and collect all Rates, Assessments, License fees, Fines, Forfeitures, Tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for the same. And all sums so collected shall be paid to the Treasurer (or in case of the Treasurer's absence to the Chairman) on the last day of every month (or oftener if required) under a penalty of any sum not exceeding £10.

4. Any person who shall keep or use a Carriage, Car, Cart, Waggon, or other Vehicle within the boundaries of the Town for seven days, without having obtained a License, to be signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

5. Any person who shall keep or use any vehicle in the course of trade or for hire, within the boundaries of the Town, without having the owner's name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

Exemptions.

- 1st.—Any Cart or Carriage belonging to Her Majesty or the Governor.
- 2nd.—Any Carriage belonging to an officiating Minister of Religion.

6. Any person residing beyond the limits of the Municipality who shall convey goods, for sale or for hire, to or from or within any part of the Municipality, shall be liable to the above scale of fees. Wool, Sandalwood, and Agricultural Produce excepted.

7. Any person who shall keep for 7 days, within the boundary of the Town, and depasture the same on Town or Crown Lands, any cattle, sheep, or goats, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding one pound.

8. Any person who shall herd Cattle within the jurisdiction of the Guildford Town Council, and who shall neglect to furnish the Chairman with a correct quarterly statement of the number of Cattle in his herd, and their owners' names, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £5.

9. Any owner or other person who shall wilfully or negligently allow any horse or other live stock to stray or be at large without a keeper within the Town boundary, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the following fines, in addition to Pound fees and damage by trespass :—

SCALE OF FINES.

- 1st.—For each Entire Horse or Bull at large by day, not less than £2 nor more than £4.
- 2nd.—For ditto ditto by night, not less than £2 nor more than £5.
- 3rd.—For every Horse, Cattle, or other live stock by day, not less than 5s. nor more than 20s.
- 4th.—For ditto ditto by night, not less than 10s. nor more than 40s.

10. Any person who shall keep for 7 days within the boundary of the Town a Dog above the age of six months, without having obtained a License signed by the Chairman, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not less than £1 nor more than £5.

SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR DOG LICENSE.

1. For every Dog above the age of 6 months ... 7s. 6d. per annum.
2. For every Bitch do. do. ... 10s. "

11. All Licenses issued by the Chairman of the Guildford Town Council shall continue in force until the 31st of December in each year.

12. Every owner or master of any Boat, Flat, or other vessel employed in carrying cargo to or from any Wharf or Jetty belonging to, or in charge of the Town Council, shall be required to pay to the Collector or Treasurer of the Council, at the end of every month, Tolls or Dues according to the following Schedule, under a penalty of any sum not exceeding £5.

SCHEDULE OF TOLLS OR DUES FOR ALL CARGO PLACED UPON ANY WHARF OR JETTY BELONGING TO, OR IN CHARGE OF, THE TOWN COUNCIL :—

1. For every ton of imported Merchandize ... 6d.
2. For every ton of Sandalwood ... 3d.
3. For every bale of Wool ... 2d.
4. For every 1000 bricks ... 6d.
5. For every yard of Stone ... 3d.
6. For every cord of Firewood ... 2d.
7. For all other Goods ... per ton 3d.

Goods or Stores belonging to the Government, the Governor, the Town Council, and Immigrants' Luggage, shall be free.

13. Any owner or master of any Boat, Flat, or other vessel, who shall neglect for 7 days, after the end of each month, to furnish the Chairman of the Town Council with a statement (or who shall knowingly send a false one) of the quantity of Merchandize and other goods taken on board, or landed from such Boat or Vessel, on or from any Jetty or Wharf belonging to or in charge of the Town Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

14. Any person who shall in the course of trade or business, within the boundaries of the Town, use any false, or any deficient weights or measures, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5.

15. Any person who shall, within the boundaries of the Town, sell any unlawfully-adulterated spirituous or fermented liquors, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £50.

16. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale, within the boundaries of the Town, any Meat, Fish, or Vegetables, unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

17. Any owner or occupier of any land, house, or premises, within the Town boundary, who shall neglect or refuse for fourteen days after due notice from the Inspector of Nuisances or the Chairman of the Council, to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building,

or pile or stack of wood, or other material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

18. Any person who shall (without first having obtained the written sanction of the Chairman of the Town Council) cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any Tree, Plant, Post, Fence, Gate, Drain, Water-course, Culvert, Jetty, Wharf, Building, or other property belonging to or in charge of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £10.

19. Any owner or occupier of any House, Shop, Store, or other building within the Town boundary, whose roof shall overhang or project over any thoroughfare or footway without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or who shall construct or have any Cornice, Crane, or Hoist, or any other fixture or projection overhanging any footway or thoroughfare, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding £5 for every month such nuisance shall remain after fourteen days' notice to remove the same shall have been given in writing by the Inspector of Nuisances, or the Chairman of the Town Council.

20. That whenever the term "Town Boundaries" or "Boundaries of the Town" occurs in these By-Laws, it shall be taken to mean "Boundary of the Municipality of Guildford."
