The said road is one chain in width, and commencing at the Murray Bridge at Pinjarra extends North-Easterly to the Causeway at South Dandalup River; thence still in a general North-Easterly direction to North Dandalup

Bridge; thence keeping same general direction about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence in a North-North-Westerly direction about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, then nearly North, crossing Balgobin and Myara Brooks, and passing along the Western boundary of Murray Location 67 to its North-West corner; thence keeping same direction about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to Derk Brook; thence in a North-North-Easterly direction to crossing of Karnet Brook; thence in a general Northerly direction, passing along the East boundary of Cockburn Sound Location No. 28, to the Upper Serpentine Bridge; thence in a North-North-Easterly direction about one mile; thence in a general North by Easterly direction, passing through Cockburn Sound Location 91 at Medulla Brook; thence in same direction to the crossing of Manjedal Brook near West boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 46; thence in a general Northerly direction to the Bridge over Cardup Brook; thence in the same direction, crossing Wongan Brook, to its junction with the Perth-Albany road near the Narrogin Inn.
