"This road commences at a spot where the Road from Denison Eastward, Gazetted 1st June, 1869, crosses the West boundary of location 318, extending due South along the East side of said West boundary across the River Irwin and along the East boundary of location 653 to its southern extremity 61 chains 97 links; thence due East 29 chains, along the North boundaries of locations 658 and 723; thence in direction North 160 deg. E. 14 chains 19 links; then North 144 deg. 51 min. East 33 chains 40 links; then North 133 degrees 39 minutes East about 14 chains 50 links; and finally North 126 deg. 51 min.
