THE following Localities have been defined as the Educational Districts for the Kojonup and Northam Districts:—

K O J O N U P .

Bounded by a circle of 15 miles radius from the centre of Kojonup Townsite.

N O R T H A M .

Bounded on the *Northward* by a line extending due East from the summit of Mount Pleasant, and by a Westerly line from same spot to Viveash's Causeway; thence along the Southern boundary of Avon Location X to its South-West corner; then by a due West line to the summit of the Darling Range. On the *Southward* by a due East line from the

North-East corner of Avon Location J; then by a line from same spot Westward along the Northern boundaries of Locations J and f, and by a due West line from the North-West corner of last named Location to the summit of the Darling Range. All bearings true.

In consequence of the foregoing, the boundaries of the undermentioned Districts will be altered as follows:—

N E W C A S T L E .

Bounded on the *Southward* by the Northern boundary of the Northam District, and by the boundaries of the Toodyay Residency, except that portion contained in the Northam District.

Y O R K .

Bounded on the *Northward* by the Northam District; on the *Southward* by the Beverley District, and by a due West line from Boyagarring Hill to the Darling Range.

A L B A N Y .

All the lands within the Plantagenet Residency, except that portion contained in the Kojonup District.
