**Townsites of Shellborough and Cossack,
North District.**

Land Office, Perth,

IT is hereby notified that a reserve,
having an area of one square mile
(six hundred and forty acres), has been
set apart for the purpose of a townsite,
and a portion of it surveyed into allot-
ments, at Condong, which will from this
date be known as "Shellborough."

A townsite reserve of one square mile
has also been set out on the land formerly
and hitherto known as Suburban Roe-
bourne, and has in part been surveyed
into lots, and named "Cossack."

The lands surveyed will be put up and
sold by the Government Resident of the
North District, or his appointee, in the
manner provided by the Land Regula-
tions for the North and East Districts.
