SECOND NOTICE.

XXIX.—SWAN DISTRICT (*Branson's near Bindoon.*)

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending respectively West 40 chains and North 25 chains from a spot 40 chains West from Moornamurra Spring, in Tillage Lease 5052; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true.

XXX.—AVON DISTRICT (*Wall's*).

Bounded on the *Southward* and *Eastward* by lines extending respectively Westward 20 chains and Northward 50 chains from the South-west corner of Avon Location 336; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings magnetic.

XXXI.—WOONGAMINE (*N.W. of Bejoording*).

On the *East* by a South line of 40 chains; and on the *South* and *West* by lines parallel and equal to the North and East boundaries.

XXXIII.—BUNBURY ROAD.—(*South of Cookernup Bridge near Logue's*).

Bounded on the *North* by lines extending East 40 chains and West 40 chains from a spot on the road from Pinjarrah to Bunbury, about 36 chains North from its intersection on the North boundary of Wellington Location 50. On the *East* by a South line of about 50 chains; and on the *South* and *West* by lines parallel and equal to the North and East boundaries.
