RAILWAY SURVEYS.

Railway Engineers and Surveyors, for the

1. An Engineering Survey of a pro-
posed line of Railway (to be of a gauge
of 42 inches) between Geraldton, Cham-
pion Bay, and Northampton, a distance
of about thirty-two miles. The work to
comprise all surveying, levelling, plan-
ning, and specifying necessary for the
setting the whole work by Contract.

The Survey to be tendered for at per
mile, and Tenders to state whether
bridges and culverts are included therein,
or separately offered at per foot.

2. A preliminary Survey for a similar
line of Railway from Guildford to York,
a distance somewhat in excess of eighty
miles, the general route of which has
already been determined on.

To include a properly benched Survey,
with longitudinal section of the whole
line, to show generally the measurement
of all bridges and culverts, but not detail
drawings or specifications.

Tenders for the above Services to include all instruments, plant, and labor; and the work in each case to be completed and plans furnished on or before the first day of June, 1873.

The work to be subject to the general supervision and direction of such person as may be appointed by the Local Government for that purpose, on whose certificate, that the same has been properly performed, payment will be made.
