WHEREAS, by a deed poll of Grant, bearing date the 13th day of October, 1842, under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the said Colony, Leschenault Location No. 41 was granted to Sir James Stirling, his heirs and assigns for ever; AND WHEREAS, by a certain other similar deed poll of Grant, bearing date the 31st day of October, 1860, Sussex Location No. 4, containing 356 acres, was granted to George Layman, his heirs and assigns; AND WHEREAS, by a certain other similar deed poll of Grant, bearing date the 25th day of October, 1842, Sussex Location No. 9, containing 653 acres, was granted to George Leake, his heirs and assigns for ever; AND WHEREAS, in and by the said several deeds poll of Grant, it is provided that it should at all times be lawful for Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, or for any person or persons acting in that behalf by Her said Majesty's or their authority, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time by Her said Majesty Her heirs or successors be deemed necessary to resume for making Roads, Canals, Bridges, Towing-paths, or other works of public utility or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to Her said Majesty, Her heirs and successors, as of Her or their former estate, without making to the said Grantees thereof respectively, their respective heirs and assigns, any compensation in respect thereof, so, nevertheless, that the lands to be resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the lands

aforesaid, and that no such resumption be made of any lands upon which any buildings might have been erected, or which might be in use as Gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such Buildings; AND WHEREAS, by virtue and in exercise of the said lastly recited powers and authorities, I the said Governor have, on the part of Her said Majesty, deemed it necessary to resume, for the making of works of public utility and convenience, the three several pieces of land after described; I do hereby NOTIFY and PROCLAIM that Her Majesty Queen Victoria has resumed and entered upon possession of ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate and being in the Sussex District, containing 3 roods and 28 perches, more or less, and being portion of the said Leschenault Location No. 41, and lying on the North side of a line 9 chains 30 links in length, extending North 117 degrees 30 minutes East from a spot on the North-west boundary of Leschenault Location 41, at the distance of 6 chains 58 links North-east from its junction with James Road to a spot on the South-east boundary of said Location 41, 17 chains 70 links North-east from its junction with Estuary Road—all bearings being true or thereabouts, and the measurements more or less; AND ALSO ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate and being in the Sussex District, containing 7 acres and 36 perches, more or less, and being portion of the said Sussex Location No. 4, and being one chain in width, lying on the North side of a line extending North 115 degrees 45 minutes East, 22 chains in length, commencing at a spot on the North-west boundary of Sussex Location 4, at the distance of 17 chains 70 links in direction North-east from its junction with Estuary Road, then North 112 degrees East 32 chains 32 links, and North 117 degrees 30 minutes East for 18 chains to a spot on the West boundary

of said Location 4, at the distance of 4 chains 92 links North from its junction with Sussex Location 7—all bearings being true or thereabouts and measurements more or less; AND ALSO ALL THAT piece or parcel of land situate and being in the Sussex District, containing 8 acres 1 rood and 20 perches, more or less, and being portion of the said Sussex Location No. 9, and being one chain in width on the Northern side of a line 84 chains in length, extending in direction North 110 degrees East from a spot on the West boundary of Sussex Location 9, at the distance of 4 chains 92 links North from its junction with Sussex Location 7 to a spot on the East boundary of said Location 9, situate 9 chains 80 links from its South-east corner—all bearings being true or thereabouts.
