IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency The Governor has received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, informing him that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance with respect to the following Acts passed during the last Session of the Legislative Council of Western Australia:—

- No. 1.—“An Act to amend the Law concerning Warrants of Distress.”
- No. 2.—“An Act to confirm the Expenditure for the services of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two beyond the grant for that year.”
- No. 3.—“An Act to Repeal the Duties on Sales by Auction and to impose a new Duty on the License to be taken out by all Auctioneers in Western Australia.”
- No. 4.—“An Act to remove some defects in the administration of the Criminal Law.”
- No. 5.—“An Act to alter the Act to impose a Duty on the Transfer of Landed Property.”
- No. 6.—“An Act to further regulate the importation of Cattle Sheep or Pigs.”
- No. 7.—“An Act to facilitate the Survey of Lands for Railway purposes.”
- No. 8.—“An Act for adopting and applying (with certain modifications and exceptions) an Act of Parliament intituled ‘An Act to abolish Forfeitures for Treason and Felony’ and to otherwise amend the law relating thereto in the Administration of Justice in the Colony of Western Australia.”
- No. 9.—“An Act to amend ‘The Wines Beer and Spirit Sale Act 1872.’”
- No. 10.—“An Act to raise a local revenue in the Northern District of Western Australia to be expended in the better protection of persons employed in various industries on the Coast of that District and for other purposes.”

- No. 11.—“An Act to repeal an Act intituled ‘An Act to regulate the hiring and service of Aboriginal Natives employed in the Pearl Shell Fishery; and to prohibit the employment of women therein,’ and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.”
- No. 12.—“An Act to declare the Law relating to Masters and Apprentices.”
- No. 13.—“An Act for licensing Carts.”
- No. 15.—“An Act to make provision for the establishment of a Law and Parliamentary Library.”
