S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*Perjuan's*).

Bounded on the *South-East* by a line 26 chains 12 links in length, extending South-west from the South-west corner of Location 346. On the *South-West* by a North-west line of 40 chains. On the *North-West* by a North-east line of 22 chains 50 links to Location 256; and on the *North-East* by a South-east line of 14 chains; then North-east 3 chains 62 links, and South-east 26 chains to the aforesaid corner of Location 346. All bearings true. This license is subject to a road. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Hubble's*).

Bounded by lines extending North-north-west 30 chains and East-north-east 33 chains 33 links from a spot 10 chains East-north-east from the North-east corner of Avon Location 246; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. Bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres

S.O.L.—AVON (*Straghan's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-west corner of Avon Location 490 where it abuts on the South-south east boundary of Avon Location 3, and extending South-south-east 13 chains 33 links, East-north-east 20 chains 35 links, South-south-east 32 chains 9 links, passing along the West-south-west boundary of Location 408; then West-south-west 56 chains 35 links, North-north-west 10 chains 92 links, East-north-east 28 chains 57 links, North-north west 34 chains 50 links, and East-north-east 1 chain 43 links, along the Southern boundary of Location 3 aforesaid to the starting point. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—WILLIAMS (*Fletcher's*).

Bounded on the *East* and *North* by lines extending South 31 chains and West 30 chains from a spot situate 15 chains North and 19 chains 46 links East from a tree situate 443 chains South-south-west magnetic from the 51-mile tree on the Road from Pinjarrah to Williams Bridge. On the *South* by a West line of 33 chains; and on the *West* by the Williams River. All bearings true, except where otherwise stated. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—CANNING (*Markwell's*).

Bounded on the *North-West* and *South-West* by lines extending respectively North-east 43 chains 87 links and South-east 22 chains 79 links from the North corner of Canning Location 4; opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. All bearings true, and subject to a Public Highway and Tramway through it. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—SWAN (*Dewar's*).

Bounded on the *North* by Swan Locations 631 and 632. On the *West* by a South line of 22 chains 90 links. On the *East* by Swan Location 630; and on the *South* by the South branch of the Gingin Brook. All bearings true. Content—106 acres.

S.O.L.—SWAN (*Atkinson's*).

Bounded on the *North* by a West line of 30 chains from the North-west corner of Swan Location 487. On the *East* by a South line of 33 chains 33 links from corner aforesaid; and on the *South* and *West* by lines parallel and equal in length to the North and East boundaries. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—COCKBURN SOUND (*Troode's*).

Bounded on the *West* by 34 chains 48 links of a Public Road. On the *South* by an East line of 29 chains, passing along the North boundaries of Location 132, and Tillage Lease 6858; and on the *North* and *East* by lines parallel and equal to the South and West boundaries. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MURRAY (*Cowcher, Brothers*).

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by lines extending East 40 chains and South 25 chains from a spot 10

chains 30 links North and 16 chains West from a marked tree; said tree being situate 35 chains 79 links in direction North 170 deg. East magnetic from the 38-mile tree on the road from Pinjarrah to Williams Bridge. The opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. All bearings true, except where otherwise stated, and the measurements more or less. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—COCKBURN SOUND (*Troode's*).

Bounded on the *South* by 31 chains 73 links of the North boundary of Location 2. On the *East* by a North line 52 chains 10 links in length. On the *North* by a West line of 17 chains 3 links; and on the *East* by a South line of 10 chains; then East 3 chains, South 17 chains 25 links, then West 17 chains 70 links and South 24 chains 85 links, passing along part of the East boundary of Clarence Townsite; all bearings true, and measurements more or less. Content—120 acres.

S.O.L.—WILLIAMS (*Crane's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *West* by lines extending East 30 chains and North 33 chains 33 links from a spot 4 chains South and 12 chains East from the North-east corner of Tillage Lease 4579, situate near Moorapulling Brook. The opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—WILLIAMS (*Munday's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending West 32 chains and North 31 chains 25 links from a spot 15 chains South and 16 chains East from a red gum tree marked JM, the said tree being situate 34 chains North-north-west from the North-east corner of Tillage Lease 4579. The opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—WILLIAMS (*Fawcett's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *West* by lines extending East 40 chains and North 25 chains from a spot on the North boundary of Tillage Lease 3193, 20 chains West from its North-east corner. The opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—WILLIAMS (*Chipper's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-east corner of Williams location 40, near the 123-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road, and extending East 31 chains 12 links, South 55 chains 6 links, West 20 chains 11 links, North 20 chains, West 5 chains 53 links, and North 35 chains 6 links along the east boundary of location 40 aforesaid, to the starting point.
