WHEREAS, by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislation, it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on WEDNESDAY, THE FIRST DAY OF JULY, 1874, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Scrivener's*).

Bounded by lines extending East 33 chains 33 links and South 30 chains from a marked tree situate about 60 chains North-west-by-North from Norrine Hill; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.
