WHEREAS, by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislation, it is made lawful for the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia for the time being to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, FREDERICK ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on WEDNESDAY, THE FIRST DAY OF JULY, 1874, at two o'clock in the afternoon, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

TWENTIETH NOTICE.

S.O.L.—PLANTAGENET (*Parson's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending West 20 chains and North 50 chains from a spot in Mortagallup Swamp, situate about 252 chains South and 40 chains West from the North-west corner of Pastoral Lease 5288; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—KOJONUP (*Hayward & Co.*).

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by lines extending 30 chains East and 33 chains 33 links South from a spot 110 chains North and 10 chains East from the South-west corner of Pastoral Lease 8672; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Emeright's*).

Bounded on the *Northward* and *Eastward* by lines extending West-south-west 50 chains and South-south-east 20 chains from a marked tree situate about 100 chains North 56 degrees West from the North-west corner of Avon Location 543 at Yarromoney; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, and bearings magnetic.
