PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency FREDERICK  
 to wit. } ALOYSIUS WELD, Esquire, Govern-

**B**Y virtue of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1855,  
 I DO HEREBY proclaim the Rules and  
 Regulations hereunder, which have been  
 framed by me with the advice of the Executive  
 Council for the observance of all Masters and  
 Commanders of all ships and vessels in that  
 part of the Port of Fremantle known as  
 Rockingham, Cockburn Sound, and of all  
 persons duly appointed and licensed to act as  
 Harbor Masters or Pilots in such Port.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal  
 of the Colony, at Government House,  
 Perth, this eighth day of July, 1874.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!!!

**RULES and REGULATIONS to be observed in  
 that part of the Port of Fremantle known  
 as Rockingham, Cockburn Sound.**

1. Vessels loading at Rockingham, in Cockburn  
 Sound, must anchor one-third of a mile from the  
 beach, having the temporary Jetty bearing about  
 South-east.

2. Vessels loading at Rockingham between the  
 15th May and the 15th November, must be moored

with an open hawse to the North-east, and send  
 down top-gallant and royal yards on deck.

3. With the wind at North-east, and the Baro-  
 meter falling, masters of vessels must run out cable  
 to ninety fathoms or more on both cables, taking  
 care that an equal strain be kept on both as the  
 wind hauls to the West.

4. Any person who shall throw or cause to be  
 thrown out of any vessel in Cockburn Sound, any  
 ballast or other substance into the water or below  
 high water mark, or who shall remove or take away  
 from any part of such harbor any sand, stone, or  
 ballast, without the consent of the Harbor Master,  
 shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £50.

5. Vessels loading with timber may run warps  
 or kedges in shore and warp the vessel as close to  
 the Jetty as their chains will allow, but on no  
 account are the anchors to be lifted from their  
 original position for the purpose of hauling along-  
 side the Jetty.

#### TWENTY-SECOND NOTICE.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*McGee's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the South-west corner of Victoria Location 570, and extending North 7 chains, West 4 chains 50 links, South 44 chains, East 26 chains 31 links, North 37 chains, West 21 chains 81 links, to spot first described. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*Smith's*, 1).

Bounded by lines starting from a spot about 60 chains North from the North-west corner of Victoria Location 755, and extending North 30 chains, West 2 chains, to South-west corner of S.O.L. 345; then North 20 chains, West 19 chains, South 50 chains, and West 21 chains to the spot first described. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*Smith's*, 2).

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending West about 32 chains to the Sea Coast, and North 40 chains from a spot 7 chains South and 28 chains East from a well; said well being situate about 72 chains West and 13 chains South from the South-west corner of Tillage Lease 6977. On the *North* by a West line of about 18 chains; and on the *West* by the Sea Coast. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*Dodd's*).

Bounded by part of the road from Dongara to the Upper Irwin, by the West, South, and East boundary of a Reserve for a Cemetery for Roman Catholics, by part of the West boundary of Victoria Location 442, by the North and West boundary of Location 266, by part of Irwin River, and by parts of the Eastern boundaries of Tillage Lease 6968 and location 795. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*Crowther's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-west corner of Tillage Lease 6969, on the left bank of the Chapman River, and extending East 34 chains, South 16 chains, East 28 chains, North 29 chains, to touch the South-east corner of a Government Reserve; then West along the South boundary of said reserve to the left bank of the Chapman River; then along the left bank of said river to the starting point. S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*G. McIntosh's*).

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by lines extending East 25 chains and South 40 chains from the South-west corner of Tillage Lease 7010, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*J. Fraser's*).

Bounded on the *South* and *West* by lines extending East 50 chains and North 20 chains from the North-west corner of Tillage Lease 7019, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Blackford's*).

Bounded on the *North* and *West* by lines extending East 60 chains and South 33 chains 33 links from a spot 2 chains North and 1 chain West from Woolba Woolba Well, said well being about 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  miles South from Dandaraga Well, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—200 acres.

S.O.L.—VICTORIA (*James Smith's*, 3).

Bounded on the *West* by a North line of about 26 chains from the North boundary of Tillage Lease 6695, and passing through the East boundary of Tillage Lease 6977. On the *North* by an East line of about 30 chains to the West boundary of Victoria Location 717. On the *East* by part of the West boundary, and the South boundary of location 717, and by a South line from the South-east corner of said location 717 to the

North-east corner of Location 477. On the *South* by the North boundary of locations 477 and 755, and part of the North boundary of Tillage Lease 6695. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Cook's*).

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by lines extending West 20 chains and South 50 chains from the North-west corner of S.O.L. 264, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Burnett's*, No. 1).

Bounded on the *North* and *East* by lines extending West 25 chains and South 40 chains from the North-west corner of Tillage Lease 5251, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Burnett's*, No. 2).

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending West 40 chains and North 25 chains from the North-east corner of Tillage Lease 5251, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Murphy's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-west corner of Melbourne Location 144, and extending West 9 chains 23 links, South 38 chains 66 links, East 40 chains 23 links, passing along part of the North boundary of Melbourne Location 142; then North 25 chains 66 links, West 12 chains, to the East boundary of Location 144; then South 8 chains, West 19 chains, and North 21 chains to the starting point. All bearings true. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Watson's*).

Bounded on the *West-south-west* and *South-south-east* by lines extending North-north-west 30 chains and East-north-east 66 chains 66 links from the North-western corner of S.O.L. 138, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—200 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Brown's*).

Bounded on the *South-south-east* and *East-north-east* by lines extending West-south-west 40 chains and North-north-west 25 chains from a spot on the Northern boundary of Avon Location 1, at a distance of 60 chains from the South-western corner of Avon Location 11, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Walton's*).

Bounded on the *North-north-west* and *West-south-west* by lines extending East-north-east 50 chains and South-south-east 20 chains from a spot 7 chains North-north-west and 10 chains East-north-east from the North-eastern corner of Tillage Lease 4840, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Powell's*).

Bounded on the *West-south-west* and *South-south-east* by lines extending North-north-west 37 chains 50 links and East-north-east 40 chains from the North-eastern corner of Avon Location 555, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—150 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Hines's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-eastern corner of Avon Location 24, and extending East-north-east 62 chains 88 links, South-south-east 7 chains 30 links, to the North-eastern corner of S.O.L. 52; then West-south-west 38 chains 88 links, South-south-east 36 chains, East-north-east 38 chains 88 links, South-south-East 10 chains 75 links, West-south-west 62 chains 88 links, and North-north-west 54 chains 5 links, to the starting point. All bearings magnetic. Content—200 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Meehan's*).

Bounded on the *North-north-west* and *West-south-west* by lines extending East-north-east 20 chains, and South-south-east 50 chains from the North-eastern corner of S.O.L. 59, and by opposite boundaries parallel equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*McDonald's*).

Bounded by lines starting from the North-western corner of Avon Location 123, and extending East-north-east 20 chains North north-west 10 chains, West-south-west 42 chains 75 links, South-south-east 1 chain, to South-eastern corner of Avon Location 158; then West-south-west 8 chains, North-north-west 1 chain, West-south-west about 7 chains 45 links, South-south-east about 21 chains 14 links, East-north-east about 38 chains 20 links, passing along part of the northern boundary of Avon Location 481, to the South-western corner of aforesaid location 123; then North-north-west 11 chains

14 links to the starting point. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres. *Note.*—This area is subject to any reserve made for Railway purposes or Roads.

S.O.L.—AVON (*Cooke's*).

Bounded on the *North-north-west* and *West-south-west* by lines extending East-north-East 33 chains, 33 links and South-south-east 30 chains from a spot 16 chains 66 links West-south-west, and 15 chains North-north-west, from Moongalling Well; said Well being situate about 4 miles East-south-east from Quelquelling, Avon Location 326, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—100 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*T. Brown's*).

Bounded by lines starting from a spot on the South boundary of Avon Location 585, at the distance of 12 chains from its South-west corner, and extending East 30 chains, South 31 chains 15 links, West 35 chains, North 13 chains 15 links, East 5 chains, and North 18 chains to the starting point. All bearings true. Content—100 acres. *Note.*—This area is subject to a road along its North boundary.

S.O.L.—AVON (*C. Smith's, jun.*).

Bounded on the *East-north-east* and *South-south-east* by lines extending North-north-west 66 chains 66 links, and West-south-west 30 chains, from the South-western corner of Avon Location 652, and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal. All bearings magnetic. Content—200 acres.

S.O.L.—AVON (*H. J. Cooke's*).

Bounded on the *West-South-West* and *South-South-East* by lines extending North-north-west 30 chains and East-north-east 33 chains 33 links from a spot 16 chains 66 links West-south-west and 15 chains South-south-east from Coorangery Well, said well being situate about 7 miles West-by-North from Goomalling Spring; and by opposite boundaries parallel and equal.
