Government Debentures.

- (1.) The National Bank of Australasia, Melbourne, are authorised to receive Tenders for Fifty Thousand Pounds' worth of Debentures, being the second moiety of the sum of One Hundred Thousand Pounds to be issued in conformity with the above recited Act, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum.
- (2.) The principal to be payable on 1st January, 1902, at the Treasury, Perth, in Western Australia, or at such place outside the limits of that Colony as the Governor may name at the option of the holder of the Debenture, in terms of clause five of the Act.
- (3.) The interest to be represented by coupons, payable on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, at the Treasury, Perth, in Western Australia, or at the National Bank of Australasia, in Melbourne, Victoria, or at the office of the Crown Agent for the Colony of Western Australia in London, as the holder may elect, in terms of clause four of the Act.

TWENTY-SEVENTH NOTICE.

S.O.L.—MELBOURNE (*Butler's*).

Bounded by lines starting from a spot on the right bank of the Moore River, and extending North about 39 chains, passing through a marked tree situate about 3 chains West from the western end of Upper Mogumbar Pool; then by an East line of about 30 chains, and by the right bank of the Moore River downwards to the starting point.
