PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency WILLIAM

WHEREAS an Act has been passed by the Imperial Parliament, intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the Session of the Thirty-fifth and Thirty-sixth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter nineteen, intituled 'An Act for the prevention "and punishment of criminal outrages upon "natives of the Islands in the Pacific Ocean;" And whereas by the sixth section of the said Act it is provided that the said Act shall be proclaimed in each Australian Colony by the Governor thereof within six weeks after a copy of it has been received by the Governor, and shall take effect in the said Colony from the date of such proclamation; and whereas a copy of the said Act has been received by the Governor within six weeks of the date hereof; Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the said provision, do by this my proclamation give notice to all persons that the said Act has been passed, and that it takes effect in this Colony from the date hereof, and all persons are hereby required to take notice of the provisions of the said Act, and to govern themselves accordingly.

No charge for sustenance to be allowed for any animal impounded after 7 p.m. in the evening, and taken out by 7 a.m. the following morning.
