Conveyance of the Albany Mail.

Each trip to be performed in 72 hours, subject to a penalty of £1 for each hour in excess of that time, to be deducted from the Contractor's monthly pay.

The mails must be carried in a four-wheeled spring vehicle.

The Contractor will be required to convey the mails at such dates in each month as the Postmaster-General may fix.

The Contractor will be required to convey and deliver all Inland Mails *en route* which may be entrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster-General, and provide secure and watertight covers for the mails.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the Contract.

No payments on account of the Contract will be made until a Bond shall have been signed by the Contractor and his sureties; and any breach of Contract will subject the Contractor to a loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay or the cancellation of his Contract.

The Contractor will be required to provide an officer of the Post Office or Telegraph

Department with a free passage to and from Albany, when required to do so.

The Contractor will be required to provide a free passage for a Mail Guard, if called upon to do so by the Postmaster-General.

The Government will reserve to themselves the right to terminate the Contract at any time by giving three months' notice.
