PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA,
to wit.

By His Honor EDWARD DOUGLASS HARVEST, Esq., Lieut.-Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Administrator of the Government of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, made and passed in the 40th year of the reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 13, intituled "The Municipal Institutions' Act, 1876," power is given to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality and to define the boundaries of such Municipality, and the wards therein, and the limits of each ward; Now THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby notify and proclaim the town of NEWCASTLE to be a Municipality under the name, style, and title of "the Council and Burgesses of Newcastle"; and I do hereby proclaim and define the limits of the said Municipality, and of the wards therein, to be as follows:—

BOUNDARIES OF THE NEWCASTLE MUNICIPALITY AND OF THE WARDS THEREIN.

NEWCASTLE MUNICIPALITY.

Bounded on the *Westward* by a North-north-westerly line from the North-west corner of Avon Location V, to the Avon River, passing along Eastward boundary of Avon Location 3. On the *Southward* by the Northward boundary of said Location 3; and on the *Northward* by the left bank of the Avon River, between the South-east and North-west corners.

NEWCASTLE WARDS.

WEST WARD.—Bounded on the *East* by a South-south-easterly line from the North-east corner of Avon Location 111, passing along East sides of Suburban Lots 4 and 22, and along East side of

Pelham Street South-south-easterly to the Southern boundary of the Townsite. On the *Southward* by part of the Southern boundary of the Townsite. On the *West* by the Western boundary of the Townsite; and on the *North* by the left bank of the Avon River.

EAST WARD.—Bounded on the *Westward* by the Eastern boundary of the West Ward. On the *South* by part of the Southern boundary of the Townsite; and on the *Northward* by the left bank of the Avon River.
