HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that from and after the 1st January next the conveyance of the Mails between Perth and the Eastern Districts, and between Perth and the Southern Districts, be conducted by the Police Department. The services will, as heretofore, be bi-weekly, and

the Mails will be carried along the following routes, viz. :—

- 1st.—Between Perth and Northam, *via* Guildford, Lakes, and York, and *vice versa*.
- 2nd.—Between Perth and Northam, *via* Guildford, Baylup, and Newcastle, and *vice versa*.
- 3rd.—Between Perth and Vasse, *via* Narrogin, Serpentine, Pinjarrah, Harvey, Australind, and Bunbury, and *vice versa*.

Detailed information as to the arrival and departure of the Mails from the General Post Office, and the various Post Offices on the respective routes, will be found in the Time Tables published by the Acting Postmaster General and Superintendent of Police in today's *Gazette*.

Passengers and parcels will be booked at any of the Post Offices and Police Stations on the before-mentioned routes, and the following will be the scale of charges :—

WITH reference to the practice of Government Officers and others, while travelling, obtaining Forage on payment at different Police Stations in the Colony, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct, that from the 1st January next the following system shall come into force :—

Government Officers and others travelling, and provided with an order from the Superin-

tendent of Police, will be permitted to obtain Forage at the different Police Stations in the Colony, but in lieu of paying for it at the time, they will give the Constable in charge of the Station a receipt for the amount of Forage received, on a printed Form contained in a book which will be kept specially for the purpose at each Police Station.

All persons other than Government Officers travelling on duty will have, in addition, to give on the face of such receipt an order on some person in Perth for the payment of the money due.

Except to Government Officers travelling on duty, no permission will be given to any persons to receive Forage at any Stations where there is a Licensed Inn.
