IN THE SUPREME COURT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

*In the matter of Edward Seckington, of Bunbury and Kojonup, a Bankrupt.*

THOMAS WILLIAM SPENCER, of Bunbury, in the Colony of Western Australia, Merchant and Storekeeper, has been appointed Trustee of the property of the bankrupt. All parties having in their possession any of the effects of the bankrupt must deliver them to the Trustee, and all debts due to the bankrupt must be paid to the Trustee.

Creditors who have not yet proved their debts must forward their proof of debts to the Trustee.
