BY virtue of the Ordinance No. 15, of 1855 (18th Victoria, No. 15), I do hereby proclaim the Rules and Regulations hereunder which have been framed by me in pursuance of the said Ordinance and Act with the advice of the Executive Council, and which are to be observed in the aftermentioned Ports and Harbours of the said Colony by all Masters and Commanders of all ships or vessels therein, respectively, and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as Harbor Masters or Pilots in such Ports or Harbours.

1.—Lockeville Timber Station and Jetty, Geographe Bay.

Vessels resorting to this anchorage for the purpose of loading timber must not anchor nearer to the shore than $4\frac{3}{4}$ or 5 fathoms, with the jetty or saw mill chimney bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Vasse lighthouse bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles. A black buoy is moored 4 cables S.E. of this position in $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

2.—Vasse Anchorage, Geographe Bay.

Vessels calling at Vasse must anchor in $4\frac{3}{4}$ or 5 fathoms, with Vasse lighthouse bearing S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Ballarat saw mill chimney East.

3.—Quindalup or Yelverton's Timber Station, Geographe Bay.

Vessels loading timber here must not anchor nearer than in $4\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 fathoms water, with Vasse lighthouse bearing E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., and Quindalup jetty bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

4.—Hamelin Bay.

Vessels resorting to this anchorage must anchor in 6 fathoms, with Edith ledge bearing N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., and highest point of Hamelin Island seen over Peak Island S.W. by S.

5.—Port Augusta, Flinders Bay.

Vessels resorting to this anchorage must anchor in 8 fathoms of water, with Matthew Point bearing S.W. by W., and Barrack Point W. by N.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation at Cape Leeuwin, in 1879, 5° Westerly ($5^{\circ} 11'$).

6.—The usual Regulations with regard to the second anchor with ample scope of chain, and during winter months the sending down of top-gallant yards and masts, are to be strictly adhered to.

7.—No vessels are to discharge ballast at these anchorages without the sanction of the Resident Magistrate, and then only in a place which shall be pointed out to them.

THE following Regulations prescribed by the Police Magistrate, Perth, and Resident Magistrate, Swan, for the keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons in the Perth and Swan Districts, are published for general information.

The Poison Sale Act, 1879.

43 Victoria, No. 14.

REGULATIONS as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons, as defined by the Act, in the city of Perth and town of Guildford.

1. All persons keeping for sale, by retail, in Perth or Guildford or elsewhere in the Perth and Swan Districts any Poisons shall keep in the shop, house of business, or other place where such Poisons are sold or exposed for sale, a book (ruled in the form set forth in Schedule C to the above Act) for the purpose of making entries therein, in accordance with section 3 of said Act, of all retail sales of any such Poisons.
2. Such book shall at all times be available for inspection by any Justice of the Peace, Police Constable, or other Peace Officer.
3. None of such Poisons shall be sold, or disposed of, or be given at any time to any person or persons under the apparent age of twenty-one years, or in a state of intoxication, nor to any convict or ticket-of-leave holder, aboriginal native, or half-caste native.
4. No person shall keep any of such Poisons for sale, for retail, in any such shop, house of business, or other place, without labelling each box, vessel, wrapper, or cover which may contain such Poisons with the word "Poisons."
