PRESENT,

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN
COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877, Her Majesty the Queen was pleased to create and constitute the Office of High Commissioner in, over, and for certain islands and places in the Western Pacific Ocean, with such powers and jurisdiction, as are in the said Order set forth.

And whereas by the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879, Her Majesty was pleased, in the Fourth Article thereof, to order that whenever the High Commissioner has occasion to leave his ordinary place of official residence in order to visit any distant places within which he has jurisdiction as High Commissioner he may appoint an Assistant High Commissioner to represent him during his absence.

And whereas it is expedient to amend and extend the provisions of the Fourth Article of the said Order of 1879.

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Pacific Islanders Protection Acts, 1872 and 1875, and by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1843 to 1878, or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Preliminary.

I. This Order may be cited as the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1880; and the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877, 1879, and this Order may be cited together as the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 to 1880.

II. This Order shall be read as if it were part of the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 and 1879.

Assistant High Commissioner.

III. The Fourth Article of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879 is hereby revoked, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder.

IV. (1.) Whenever the High Commissioner has occasion to leave his ordinary place of official residence in order to visit any distant places within which he has jurisdiction as High Commissioner, or at any other time, with the previous sanction of Her Majesty conveyed through the Secretary of State, he may, by an instrument under his hand and official Seal, appoint a Judicial Commissioner, or some one of Her Majesty's Deputy Commissioners for the Western Pacific, to represent him in his Office of High Commissioner; and the person so appointed shall be styled the Assistant High Commissioner, and may, so long as his appointment remains in force, exercise all the powers and authorities of the High Commissioner, or so much thereof as is specified in the Instrument appointing him.

(2.) Such appointment shall not affect the right of the High Commissioner to exercise his full power and authority in any place within his jurisdiction.

(3.) The High Commissioner may revoke any such appointment by a similar instrument; and every such appointment, if made on account of the absence of the High Commissioner, shall cease on his return to his ordinary place of official residence.

V. In this Order, and in the Western Pacific Orders in Council of 1877 and 1879, unless inconsistent with the context, the High Commissioner includes the person for the time being exercising any of the powers and authorities of High Commissioner under the provisions of this Order, or of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1877 or of 1879.

VI. This Order shall commence and have effect on the 15th day of November, 1880, and shall be published in the Royal Gazette of Fiji, and in such other manner as the High Commissioner thinks fit.

And the Right Honorable Earl Granville, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, and the Right Honorable the Earl of Kimberley, two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THE following Regulations prescribed by the Resident Magistrate, York, for the keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons in the Town and District of York, are published for general information.

The Poison Sale Act, 1879.

43 Victoria, No. 14.

REGULATIONS as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of Poisons, in the Town and District of York.

Whereas "The Poison Sale Act, 1879," enacts that the undermentioned articles, viz. :—

- Arsenic and its preparations,
- Prussic Acid,
- Cyanides of Potassium and all Metallic Cyanides,
- Strychnine and all poisonous vegetable alkaloids and their salts,
- Aconite and its preparations,
- Emetic Tartar,
- Corrosive Sublimate,
- Cantharides,
- Savin and its Oil,
- Ergot of Rye and its preparations,

shall be deemed Poisons within the meaning of the said Act;

That a person selling such Poison shall be licensed by the Resident Magistrate of his District;

That he shall observe all the Regulations respecting the sale of Poison, as specified in section 3; and that he shall conform to such further Regulations as to keeping, dispensing, and selling of such Poison as may from time to time be prescribed by the Resident Magistrate of his District:

Notice is hereby given that the following Regulations will be enforced in the Town and District of York.

1. The book required by section 3 to be kept for the purpose of making entries therein of the sale of Poison shall at all times be available for inspection by any Justice of the Peace, Police Constable, or other Peace Officer.
2. None of such Poisons shall be sold, or disposed of, or be given at any time to any person under the apparent age of twenty-one years, or in a state of intoxication, nor to any convict or ticket-of-leave holder, aboriginal native, or half-caste native.
3. No person shall keep any of such Poisons for sale, by retail, in any shop, house of business, or other place, without labelling each box, vessel, wrapper, or cover which may contain such Poisons with the word "Poison."

Fresh Meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three day's supply of Mutton to four day's supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The supplies to be delivered at such places and times as may be required by the Government or persons deputed by it.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lb.; or Onions, ¼lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No Transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the *previous consent* of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the bonâ fide signatures of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each Contract.
