WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 10th February, 1882, under the hand of The Governor, and Public Seal of the Colony, the said Governor did prohibit the landing and importation into the Colony of horses, except in accordance with and subject to the restrictions and regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas the restrictions and regulations aforesaid were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th February, 1882, and whereas the said Governor is desirous of annulling the said prohibition and restrictions and regulations: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby annul the prohibition, restrictions, and regulations so made and published as aforesaid.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that a despatch has been received from the Government of India, stating that Waler horses for Army purposes will be purchased during the year 1882-83, to the number and conditions, as follows:—

At Madras One hundred,
,, Calcutta Seventy-five.

Except under special circumstances, purchases will be made only between the 15th September and 28th February.

Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 7 years, except as regards country breeds. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

After the expiration of three (3) years from the 21st June, 1879, greys will not be purchased for Horse or Field Artillery.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rupees five hundred and fifty (Rs. 550). Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

HIS Excellency the Governor, in Executive Council, has been pleased, in accordance with the provisions of “The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878,” to frame the following Regulations for the management of the William Street Jetty, in Perth water.

Regulations for the Management of William Street Jetty, Perth, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, 42nd Vict., No. 18.

1.—No Vessel or Boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetty at William Street, Perth, except to such ring-bolts or other fastenings as are, or may be expressly provided for that purpose, and no Vessel or Boat shall be alongside such Jetty unless so fastened.

2.—No Vessel or Boat shall be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

3.—Cargo or other Vessels or Boats lying on the N.W. side of the Jetty shall, on the approach of a Passenger Steamer, haul off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark passengers.

4.—No Vessel, Cargo Boat, or Flat shall make fast, or lie alongside the Jetty, for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo, after sunset or before daylight, unless by permission of the Superintendent of Police or the Mayor of Perth.

5.—No fishing nets shall be hung or spread about any part of the Jetty. No fishing off the Jetty will be permitted on Sunday, and at other times with only a rod and line.

6.—No Stone, Bricks, Sand, Lime, Firewood, or Timber in Logs, with the exception of Sandalwood, shall be loaded or unloaded on the Jetty. Firewood may be carted on the Jetty for the use of Steamers, but must be taken direct from the Cart to the Steamers.

7.—All goods must be removed from the Jetty before sunset, unless by permission of the Superintendent of Police or the Mayor of Perth.

8.—No Bullock Teams shall be driven on the Jetty.

9.—No Gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetty without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.

10.—No goods shall be landed on the Jetty on Sunday, except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of the Superintendent of Police or the Mayor of Perth being first obtained.

11.—No stones or any kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from the Jetty or Boats lying alongside.

12.—No Fire or Fires shall be made on or near the Jetty.

13.—All Goods and Merchandise carted on to the Jetty must be carefully removed from the Carts, and not shot off them. This regulation shall not, however, apply to any cart loaded with sand, gravel, soil, or manure.

14.—No Bathing allowed off or near the Jetty after 7 in the morning nor before 8 in the evening.

Any Person or Persons violating these Regulations will be prosecuted according to the Act 42 Victoria, No. 18.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

SPENCER GULF.

(1) CORNY POINT LIGHT—DELAY IN EXHIBITION.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 40 (1), of 22nd March, 1881, on the proposed exhibition, on or about 10th January, 1882, of a light from a lighthouse to be erected on Corny Point, east side of Spencer Gulf:—

The Government of South Australia has given further Notice, that from unforeseen circumstances, the light will not be exhibited until 1st March, 1882:—

The light will be a fixed white light of the third order, visible seaward through an arc of 200°, or between the bearings of N. 45° E. and S. 65° W.; it will be elevated 98 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

The lighthouse, keepers' dwellings, and store room are painted white.

Position approximate, lat. 34° 54' 0" S., long. 137° 1' 0" E.

ST. VINCENT GULF.

(2) PORT ADELAIDE—LEADING LIGHTS AT ENTRANCE.

Also, has given Notice, that on 18th October, 1881, two leading lights (placed 217 yards apart) would be exhibited at the entrance to Port Adelaide:—

The upper light is a powerful fixed red light, the lower light is fixed white.—Brought in line bearing N.E. by E. (nearly) they lead over the outer bar, midway between the bar buoys.

Vessels should keep these lights in line until within half a cable's length of the lower light (white) when a course can be steered for No. 11 beacon light.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

(1) PORT JACKSON—LEADING LIGHTS FOR EAST CHANNEL.

The Government of New South Wales has given Notice, that on 20th December, 1881, two leading lights would be exhibited from lighthouses recently erected in the vicinity of Vaucluse Bay, eastern side of entrance to port Jackson:—

The lights are fixed red lights, and kept in line (or the lighthouses during the day) bearing S. ½ E. lead through the eastern channel, which has been dredged to not less than 27 feet at low water spring tides.

NEW ZEALAND.

MIDDLE ISLAND—COOK STRAIT.

(2) LEADING LIGHTS AT TORY CHANNEL ENTRANCE.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 1st January, 1882, two leading lights would be exhibited from beacons erected on Alapawa Island, Tory Channel entrance, Cook Strait:—

The lights are fixed white lights of the fifth order; the low light is elevated 22 feet above high water, and is placed 12 yards from high water mark; the high light is elevated 86 feet above high water, and is distant 166 yards from the low light.

The beacons, 21 feet high, are pyramidal in shape, and painted white.

Position approximate of low light, lat. 41° 12' 10" S., long. 174° 19' 20" E.

These lights kept in line lead through the centre of the entrance to Tory Channel.

(The bearing is Magnetic. Variation 10½° Easterly in 1882.)
