HIS Excellency the Governor directs the following extracts from a report, dated 4th May, of the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, to be published for general information.

*Extracts from Report.*

"I sailed from Cossack on 14th April, in search of "Ruby," missing, and received before leaving a communication from the Police (oral) of a native report of wreckage on or in the immediate neighborhood of Depuct Island. I deemed it advisable, in the first instance, to examine the islands in its neighborhood. Anchoring under Depuct, on the morning of 15th, I organised two boat parties, the Mate to examine Forrester's Island while I examined Depuct; both returned without finding, after careful search, a vestige of wreckage."

"Leaving early next morning, I steered for the Montebello Islands, and anchoring there on the 19th instant, I carefully examined these islands as well as the Lowendal Group, without finding the smallest trace of the "Ruby," or indeed any wreckage. I had intended visiting Barrow Island, and was indeed within a few miles of it, but the weather was so bad that I was reluctantly compelled to forego it; there is just a bare possibility of some of the "Ruby's" people being on Barrow Island, but if they did reach this place, there being a station there, they would be well cared for; had this not been the case, I should have fought through any difficulties and examined it. Leaving Lowendal Islands, I examined the islands off the main—from the neighborhood of Fortescue River, Cape Preston, Dampier's Archipelago, &c., up to Cossack, as well as the coast line, I regret to say, without finding anything, and returned here, after an absence of ten days, on the 23rd instant. There can be little doubt but that the "Ruby" foundered at sea. It is, however, just possible she may have cut away her mast, and may either have turned up or be still afloat."

"I may casually remark in this brief report that I was amazed at the capabilities of and facilities of Roebuck Bay as a port affording excellent anchorage and shelter for vessels of any tonnage, close to the

shore. I anchored quarter of a mile off in 8½ fathoms. I may mention that this is the Northern portion of the Bay, *erroneously* marked on charts, and that the anchorage of vessels in the days of Roebuck Bay Company was actually not in *Roebuck Bay at all*. Roebuck Bay is *without question* the best port known as yet for the Kimberley District. A port to which any vessel of any tonnage (after port being properly surveyed) will find no difficulty in *insuring* for. I cannot *too strongly* urge the necessity of detailed survey of this port."

**H**IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that a despatch has been received from the Government of India, stating that Waler horses for Army purposes will be purchased during the year 1882-83, to the number and conditions, as follows:—

At Madras ... ..	One hundred,
„ Calcutta ... ..	Seventy-five.

Except under special circumstances, purchases will be made only between the 15th September and 28th February.

Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 7 years, except as regards country breds. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

After the expiration of three (3) years from the 21st June, 1879, greys will not be purchased for Horse or Field Artillery.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at Rupees five hundred and fifty (Rs. 550). Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.
