WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on WEDNESDAY, THE TWENTY-SIXTH DAY OF JULY, 1882, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, within the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under the provisions of Rule 106 of the Land Regulations, proclaimed on the 14th September, 1878, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to place the Greenough Commonage under the management of the Greenough District Roads Board, and has approved of the following rules for the use of the Commonage; viz:—

GREENOUGH COMMONAGE RULES.

Rule 1.—That during the month of January in every year the sum of 1s. per head for horses and cattle and 1d. (one penny) per head for sheep and goats shall be levied on every owner of stock making use of the Commonage within the Greenough District, and paid to the Chairman of the Local Board.

Rule 2.—That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock situate within the Greenough District and making use of the Commonage to give a correct number of horses, cattle, sheep, and goats during the month of January in every year, and obtain a certificate from the Chairman of the Roads Board showing the number and description of such stock.

Rule 3.—That all arrears of taxes levied on account of the Greenough Commonage remaining unpaid on the 1st of March in each year, after these rules are put in force, shall be sued for by the Chairman of

the Roads Board in the Local Court of that District, and on conviction such stock which is proceeded against shall be rendered liable to be seized and sold by order of the Court to defray expenses.

Rule 4.—That all owners of stock neglecting to comply with these rules shall be subject to a penalty of any sum not exceeding £2, exclusive of costs and the full fees as stated in Rule 1.

Rule 5.—That all fees and fines shall be for and on account of the ordinary funds of the Greenough Roads Board.

Rule 6.—The only persons exempt from these rules shall be bonâ fide travellers taking stock to market or to outside stations, and to such only on condition of their stopping not more than 24 hours on the Commonage; otherwise they shall be dealt with as trespassers.

Rule 7.—That all persons taking up land within the boundaries of the Commonage, either by purchase or S.O.L., shall not be entitled to trespass unless their boundaries are defined by a cleared line.

Rule 8.—The boundaries of the Commonage and District must be minutely defined by a new map supplied by Government to enable the Board to know who are residing in it and liable to come under the operation of these rules.
