AUSTRALIA—NORTH-EAST COAST.

(1) SAND BANK REPORTED IN MARGARET BAY.

The Government of Victoria has given notice of the existence of a sand bank, with 3 feet over it at low water spring tides, lying in the southern part of Margaret bay, with the following bearings and distance:—

Northern extremity of cape Grenville ... E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.
Centre of Sunday island ... N. by W., distant one mile.

This bank, though out of the main navigation, is a danger to vessels seeking anchorage in Margaret bay, or working along the coast under shelter of cape Grenville.

MIDDLE ISLAND—EAST COAST.

(2) ALTERATION IN TIMARU PRINCIPAL LIGHT.

The Government of New Zealand has given Notice, that on 1st May, 1882, the following alteration would be made in the principal light exhibited at Timaru harbour:—

Perth Poor House,
September 21st, 1882.

SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 5th inst., visited and inspected the Perth Protestant Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 29; infant boys, 3; maintained by private funds, 2; total number, 34.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking.

There has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct continues good.

The provisions supplied are of good quality, and the children are allowed sufficient for their wants.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, under the supervision of the matron.

The same day I visited and inspected the Native and Half-caste Mission, Perth. Number of boys, 7; girls, 13; total number, 20.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking.

There has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct continues good.

The food supplied is of good quality, and the children are allowed sufficient for their wants.

September 6th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 55; maintained by private funds, 23; total number, 78.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The food supplied is of good quality, and the children are not stinted.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, and also assist in the routine work of the institution.

September 7th.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 55; maintained by private funds, 12; total number, 67.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied to them is of good quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

There has been no sickness amongst the children during the quarter, and their conduct continues good.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, and also assist in the routine work of the institution, and are besides brought up to habits of industry.

September 13th.—Visited and inspected the Swan Protestant Orphanage for boys. Number of Government inmates, 32; maintained by private funds, 5; total number, 37.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied is of good quality, and the children are not stinted.

Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The elder boys assist in the routine work of the institution, and are also brought up to habits of industry.

The dormitories at each institution were clean and well ventilated.

"The Stamp Act, 1881," has been repealed, and the provisions thereof have been re-enacted, with amendments, by "The Stamp Act, 1882," which commences and takes effect from the first day of October, 1882.

Every Instrument, *i.e.*, all written documents, matters, or things enumerated, must be stamped on the face of such instrument, and every stamp so used must be duly cancelled by writing across it the person's initials, together with the true date.

Every person who refuses to cancel a stamp, or wilfully neglects to do so, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.

Persons having doubts as to the amount of Stamp Duty, may apply to the Colonial Treasurer for adjudication; the fee being One Shilling.
