HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the following By-Laws passed by the Roebourne Commonage Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Common Lands.

By His Excellency's Command,

1. That during the month of January of each year the sum of 1s. (one shilling) per head for horses and cattle, and 1d. (one penny) per head for sheep and goats shall be levied on every owner of stock residing in the Roebourne Commonage, and paid to Chairman of Commonage Board.
2. That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock situate within the Roebourne Commonage, and making use of the Commonage, to give a correct number of horses, cattle, sheep, and goats, during the month of January in every year, and obtain a certificate from the Chairman of the Board showing the number and description of such stock.
3. No stock to be kept on the Commonage unless the property of persons residing within it.
4. That all stock depasturing on the Commonage, the property of one person, shall not exceed of cattle and horses (15) fifteen of each, and of sheep shall not exceed (50) fifty, except sheep for killing purposes, which shall not exceed (240) two hundred and forty, and that if they exceed that number the sum of (5s.) five shillings per head be charged for horses and cattle, and 1s. per head for sheep.
5. That all arrears of taxes levied on account of the Roebourne Commonage remaining unpaid on the 1st March in each year, after these Rules are put in force, shall be sued for by the Chairman of the Roebourne Commonage in the Local Court of this District, and on conviction such stock which is proceeded against shall be rendered liable to be seized and sold by order of the Court to defray expenses.

6. That all owners of stock neglecting to comply with these Rules shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding £2, exclusive of costs, and the full fees as stated in Rule 1.
7. All fees and fines shall be for and on account of the Roebourne Commonage.
8. That the only persons exempt from these Rules shall be *bonâ fide* travellers' travelling stock, and to such only on condition of their stopping not more than (24) twenty-four hours on the Commonage, and to teams travelling not more than (48) forty-eight hours.
9. Stray cattle, horses, and sheep from runs adjoining to be allowed to occupy the Commonage without paying any fees, if shown to be accidentally upon it, and if steps are taken at once for their removal.

IMMIGRATION.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 21st October, 1882.*

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that in order to further develop the system of Nominated Immigration at present in force in this Colony, persons wishing to obtain *Free Passages* from the United Kingdom for their friends, or such other persons as they may desire to introduce into the Colony, can obtain printed forms of application and all necessary information from the Immigration Officer at Perth, or from the Resident Magistrate of the district in which the applicant resides.

William Felgate, Esq., 27, Clements Lane, London, will continue to act as Emigration Agent.

Nominated Emigrants will be required, prior to being furnished with a passage, to sign an agreement to remain three years in the Colony, or refund to the Colonial Government the cost of their passage from England.

Nominated Emigrants who are too poor to pay their expenses to the port of embarkation will, on the production of a Certificate to that effect from the Minister or Constable of the parish in which such Emigrant resides, have their reasonable expenses paid on application to the Agent.

Persons resident in the Colony wishing to nominate Emigrants through the medium of friends in England may do so by application through the Immigration Officer, Perth; and upon the Emigrant so nominated being recommended to the Agent, a free passage on the usual conditions will be provided.

No charge will be made for mess, kit, or bedding provided for infants under one year old.

A certain number of single female domestic servants will be introduced annually, and persons requiring this class of servant are requested to communicate with the Immigration Officer, Perth, who will record their applications.

11. From Geraldton to Newmarricarra, thence to Tibradden, Sandsprings, Ellendale, Minnanooka, Glengarry, and Greenough, and thence to Geraldton, once a week, on horseback.

12. From Bannister to Wandering, and *vice versa*, three times a month, on horseback.
13. From Bannister to Marradong, and *vice versa*, once a fortnight, on horseback.
14. From Perth to Wanneroo, and *vice versa*, once a week, on horseback.
15. From Bunbury to Balbarrup, *via* Dardanup and Bridgetown, and *vice versa*, once a week, on horseback.
16. From Bunbury to Balbarrup, *via* Dardanup and Bridgetown, and *vice versa*, once a week, in a spring vehicle.
17. To convey mails, deliver letters, &c., between Guildford and Chittering, and *vice versa*, once every four weeks, and between Guildford and Swan, and *vice versa*, once a week, on horseback.

The arrival and departure of the Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

Fresh Meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The supplies to be delivered at such places and times as may be required by the Government or persons deputed by it.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1 lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week; Pumpkins, 2 lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½ lbs.; or Onions, ¼ lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Corn and Flour sacks, and Oil casks, will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the *previous consent* of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the bonâ fide signatures of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each Contract.
