RULE FOR BOOKING PASSENGERS.

At any time after the departure of a Mail Coach from Perth for Albany, passengers may apply for seats in the next succeeding one. They must deposit half passage fare at the time of application, and two clear days before the Coach leaves these applications will be considered in the order in which they have been received, and tickets issued to passengers on receipt of the balance of passage money, preference being given to passengers travelling "On Public Service."

In the event of people not travelling by the Coaches in which they have applied for seats, the deposit of half-fare made by them will be forfeited, if they fail to secure their seats through their own neglect.

Applications for passages to Williams, Kojonup, and other roadside places will be received and treated in the same way as those for Albany; but in all cases preference will be given to through passengers or those going the longest distance.
