SIR,—I have the honor to report having, on the 14th of December, visited and inspected the Protestant Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 28; infant boys, 3; maintained by private funds, 2; total number 33. They were clean, neatly clothed, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied is good in quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

Their health during the quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The children attend school, which is conducted on the premises; they also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The same day, I visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for girls. Number of Government inmates, 58; maintained by private funds, 22; total number, 80.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The food supplied them is good in quality and they are not stinted.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises, and also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

December 20th.—Visited and inspected the Protestant Orphanage for boys on the Swan. Number of Government inmates, 32; private, 5; total number 37.

The children were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

Their health during the past quarter has been good, and their conduct satisfactory.

The food supplied them is good in quality and they are not stinted.

Several very necessary sanitary improvements have lately been carried out at the Orphanage, which will tend to promote the health and comfort of the inmates.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

December 22nd.—Visited and inspected the Roman Catholic Orphanage for boys at Subiaco. Number of Government inmates, 53; maintained by private funds, 10; total number 63.

They were clean, neatly clothed, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated.

The food supplied is of good quality and the children are not stinted.

Their health during the quarter has been good.

They attend school, which is conducted on the premises; they also assist in the routine work of the Institution.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

December 22nd.—Visited and inspected the Native and Half-Caste Mission. Number of boys, 7; do. girls, 12; total number, 19.

The children were clean, and healthy looking, and appeared well fed and treated. There has been no sickness amongst them during the quarter, and their conduct has also been satisfactory.

The food supplied is of good quality, and they are allowed sufficient for their wants.

The dormitories were clean and well ventilated.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the areas in the Victoria District hereinafter described, and more particularly defined on the authenticated map in this office, shall be classified as Mineral lands; provided, however, that if it be shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, by a report from the Government Inspector of Mineral lands, that any land within such areas, applied for to purchase as Rural land, is of such a character that there is no reason to suppose mineral lodes exist beneath the surface, then such application may be dealt with in the usual way, and the land classed and disposed of as Rural.
