WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

A COMMISSION passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, appointing Frederick Napier Broome, Esq., C.M.G., to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

Dated 14th December, 1882.

VICTORIA R.

Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India: To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Frederick Napier Broome, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Greeting.

WE do by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet appoint you, the said Frederick Napier Broome, to be during Our pleasure Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

Appointment of Frederick Napier Broome, Esq., C.M.G., as Governor.

II. And We hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in Our Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, constituting the Office of Governor, bearing date at Westminster, the Seventeenth day of November, 1877, in the Forty-first year of Our Reign, according to such Orders and Instructions as Our Governor for the time being hath already received from Us, or as you shall hereafter receive from Us.

Recites Letters Patent constituting the office of Governor.

III. And further We do hereby appoint that, so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed oaths and have entered upon the duties of your office, this Our present Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of January 1880, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir William Cleaver Francis Robinson, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Our said Colony and its Dependencies.

Commission to Sir W. C. F. Robinson, K.C.M.G., as Governor, dated 28th January, 1880, superseded.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said Colony and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Officers, &c., to obey the Governor.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this Fourteenth day of December, 1882, in the Forty-sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the seventeenth day of November, 1877, and in the forty-first year of Her said Majesty's Reign, was pleased to constitute, order and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies; and that the person who should fill the said office of Governor should be from time to time appointed by Commission, under Her said Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet; And whereas Her said Majesty was further pleased by a Commission under Her Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Windsor, the fourteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-sixth year of Her said Majesty's Reign, to appoint me, the said FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the said Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, with all and singular the powers and authorities granted to the Governor of the said Colony in the said above recited Letters Patent: Now THEREFORE it is hereby proclaimed and made known that all and singular the powers and authorities granted in the said Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, dated at Westminster, the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, have devolved on me the said FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony of Western Australia; and having taken the oaths prescribed by law to be taken in that behalf, I have this day assumed the Government of the said Colony, and all and singular Her Majesty's Officers, Ministers, and Subjects in the said Colony, and all others whom it may concern, are required to take due notice thereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, this second day of June, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
