CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 7th November, 1884.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of the Queen in Council, dated the 17th of October last, exempting from Remeasurement, in any Port or Place in Her Majesty's Dominions, Belgian Vessels, the tonnage of which is denoted in the Certificates of Belgian Nationality or Registry, issued after the 1st of January, 1884.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862," it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of Merchant Ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any Foreign Country, and are in force in that Country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such Foreign Country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers; and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's Dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their Certificates of Registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of Merchant Ships now in force under "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of the Belgians, with the exception of a slight difference in the mode of estimating the allowance for engine-room, and such rules are now in force in that Country, having come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1884.

HER MAJESTY is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships belonging to Belgium, the measurement whereof on or after the said 1st day of January, 1884, shall have been ascertained and denoted in the

Certificates of Registry, or other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such Certificates of Registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steam-ships, that merchant ships belonging to Belgium which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine-room, the measurement whereof on or after the said 1st day of January, 1884, shall have been ascertained and denoted in the Certificates of Registry, or other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such Certificates of Registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificates of Registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ship, provided, nevertheless, that, if the owner or master of any such steam-ship desires the deduction for engine-room in such ship to be estimated under the rules for engine-room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the Belgian rules, the engine-room shall be measured, and the deductions calculated, according to the British Rules.

SIR,—I have the honor to forward to Your Excellency the accompanying hydrographical information, relating to dangers recently ascertained to exist on the North-west Coast of this Colony.

Relating to dangers recently ascertained to exist between Cambridge Gulf and the North-west Cape, North-west Coast of Australia.

All Bearings are magnetic.

Variation, { Cambridge Gulf, 2° E.
1884. { Cape Baskerville, 0° 50' E.
 { North-West Cape, 1° 10' W.

King Shoal, at the entrance to Cambridge Gulf, is about nine miles long in a N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. direction, its eastern edge (red sand) being awash at low water springs. There are depths of 10 and 12 fathoms, mud and sand, close alongside the eastern edge of this danger. From the north-west extreme (1884) of King Shoal, the summit of Lacrosse Island bears S.E. by S., distant about 15 miles, and Buckle Head W. by N., distant about 19 miles.

From a position close to the North shore of Lacrosse Island the ebb stream sets at the rate of five and six knots at springs towards and across King Shoal.

The summit of Lacrosse Island, bearing S. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., leads nearly in mid-channel between Medusa Bank and King Shoal.

A rock, which dries about four feet at low water springs, lies about a cable's length northward of the northernmost rocky islet in the West Arm abreast of Steep Head.

The channel which formerly existed between the South shore of Adolphus Island and the Mangrove Islets has shoaled extensively, and a sand bank, which dries at low water springs, extends nearly across from the North shore of the Western Mangrove Islet to Adolphus Island.

The "Shoal Channel," of Commander P. P. King's chart, is the only navigable channel (1884) into the South-East Arm of the Gulf; but vessels without local knowledge are recommended not to attempt to proceed beyond View Hill, and to anchor westward of a line joining the South extreme of the high land of Adolphus Island and North-west extreme of the Mangrove Islets.

Roe Bank, of sand, dries ten feet at low water springs, and lies in the West Arm with the following limits:—Summit (north extreme) of Quoin Hill bearing from E. by S. to E. by N., and western fall of the Bastion Hills bearing from S. by W. to S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. A channel, with depths of 7 to 9 fathoms, and about a cable's length wide, passes close westward of Roe Bank.

Two reefs, upon which the sea breaks occasionally at low water, lie to the eastward of Adele Island, in the following approximate positions:—North Breaker, latitude 15° 30' S., longitude 123° 25' E. South Breaker, latitude 15° 33' S., longitude 123° 23' E.

Panton Reef, a narrow strip of coral, about half-a-mile in extent in an East and West direction, lies about 5 miles westward of Cape Baskerville. The least water found (4 feet) lies near the western end of this danger, with the following bearings:—

Western of the two conspicuous dark clumps of bushes, seen just southward of the red cliffs forming the North extreme of the land about Cape Baskerville, bearing E.N.E.; and sandhills between Coulomb Point and Cape Bertholet (visible extreme of land to the southward), bearing South.

The sea breaks on Panton Reef at low water and there is a depth of 7 fathoms, sand, between the reef and the shore. Vessels proceeding inside the Lacedpede Islands are recommended to approach Cape Baskerville with caution, as indications of foul ground were seen to the southward of Panton Reef.

Taunton Reef has 8 feet and less water on it, and lies in the fairway of the channel (eastward of Airlie Island) between Ashburton Road and Mary Ann Passage, with the summit of Airlie Island bearing West, distant about two miles. The sea only breaks on this danger at low water, and with a westerly swell. There are depths of 7 and 8 fathoms between Taunton Reef and Airlie Island.

A Coral Reef extends two miles in a W.N.W. direction from the West extreme of Airlie Island, with depths of 2 fathoms and less water over it.

Otway Reef, on which the sea has been seen to break, is reported to lie about midway between Sunday and Observation Islands.

A Coral Reef extends from the South shore of Thevenard Island, its outer edge lying with the Western extreme of Thevenard Island bearing N.E., distant four miles. This reef has 2 fathoms and less water on it.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

(1) REVOLVING LIGHT ON DOUBLE ISLAND POINT.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 202 (1), of 24th October 1884, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse erected on the summit of Double Island point:

The Queensland Government has given further Notice, that on 11th September 1884, the light would be exhibited:

The light is a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every thirty seconds, elevated 315 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 24 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is holophotal dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse is circular in shape, and painted stone colour.

Position, lat. 25° 56' S., long. 153° 12' E.

ENDEAVOUR RIVER ENTRANCE.

(2) GRASSY HILL—ADDITIONAL TIDAL SIGNALS.

Also, has given Notice, that in order to indicate the depth of water on the bar of Endeavour river, when it is less than 10 feet, the following signals will, on and after 2nd September 1884, be added to the code previously in use on Grassy Hill:
