A Reward of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS is offered by Nance County, Nebraska, for the apprehension and conviction of

the murderer or murderers of HARRY G. PERCEVAL, his wife and Infant Child, HUGH MAIR & H. A. G. BAIRD, who were killed at their residences twelve miles west of Fullerton, in Nance County, Neb., on or about September 29th, 1884.

THE FULLERTON MURDER.

Mystery still surrounds the terrible murder at Fullerton, Neb., in which our citizens are so deeply interested. A Mr. Young, who has a brother living near the scene of the tragedy, reported here this week that the body of Furnivall had been found. This information does not comport, however, with the following despatch published in the "Minneapolis Tribune," of Wednesday:—

Omala, Oct. 14.—The following is the verdict in the case of the quadruple murder near Fullerton, Nance County, in this State.

"We believe that H. A. G. Baird, Hugh Mair, Harry Perceval, "Mrs. Harry Perceval, and her one-year-old child came to their "death feloniously, Sunday evening, September 28th, and "Monday, September 29th, 1884; and that they came to their "death by wounds from weapons in the hands of one George "Furnivall.—S. HENEY."

"Furnivall.—S. HENEY." The details of the murder, as brought forth by the investigation, are as follows:—Furnivall and Mair went to Edmondson's, Sunday, and from there Furnivall and one of the Edmondson boys went to a paint office a few miles distant, and Mair and another Edmondson went to Clarke. Furnivall went to Edmondson's first, and was mad because Mair had not got back: it being Mair's work to do the cooking. Mair returned soon and enquired if Furnivall had gone home. On being told that he had, he hurried home, saying "George will be mad "because I am not there to cook supper." A quarrel took place upon Mair's return, and ended in Mair not getting Furnivall's supper, and Furnivall, in his rage, loaded his gun and shot Mair while he was in bed. Baird had been in the habit of coming every night from Perceval's and bathing in a creek near the house. He generally went in and had a chat with Mair. It is supposed that he carried out his usual habit, Monday night, and discovered Mair's dead body, and was shot and thrown into the creek by Perceval', on the principle that "dead men tell no tales." Furnivall knew that enquiry after Baird would be made upon Perceval's return, and as it was impossible to get far until the train left Fullerton, Tuesday morning, he waited for Perceval's return from Fullerton, Monday night, and when he went for hay for his horses, shot him down, and ended his foul crime by shooting Mrs. Perceval, with whom he had previously had trouble. After murdering Mrs. Perceval's pocket book. It is not thought that he could have secured over S100, and this, with S98 obtained at the First National (where he had left a note as security a week previous), is thought to be the only money he had with him. The shoes Furnival had on on Monday, when A. H. Bird was there, were found in the stove, where he burned them. A paper was found on which was written, "wait "until to-morrow night, and I will see what my chances are." Funivall's best friends now admit his guilt. The testimoy taken by the Coroner's jury fills nearly two hundred pages.

Mr. Frank Tanner arrived in this city Wednesday even-ing, and we understand pronounces the despatch in the "Tribune" mainly correct.—*Owatonna Journal*, Oct. 17.

TORRES STRAIT.

(1) MURRAY ISLANDS-REFUGE STATION. The Queensland Government has given Notice, dated 29th October, 1884, that the crews of vessels which may be wrecked in the more northerm part of the Coral sea, may make without hesitation for Murray Islands, eastern approach to Torres strait.

(1) EASTERN LIGHTHOUSE-ALTERATIONS IN UPPER LIGHT, DISCONTINUANCE OF LOWER LIGHT.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 97, of 21st July 1874, on the establishment of Eastern light, immediately under Arthur's Seat, South channel, Port Phillip; and No. 15, of 31st January, 1878, on the exhibition of an auxiliary white light, placed 40 feet below the above mentioned light:— The Government of Victoria has given further Notice, that on 1st January, 1885, a new and more powerful light would be exhibited in lieu of the previous upper light; and that the lower light would be discontinued:— The mew Eastern light shows as heretofore fixed red between the bearings of S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and fixed white between S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. it is clevated 100 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 13 miles. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

AUSTRALIA-NORTH COAST. CLARENCE STRAIT.

(2) VERNON ISLANDS-BUOY MARKING SHOAL GROUND. The Government of South Australia has given Notice, dated 5th December, 1884, that a buoy has been placed near the western end of the shoal ground lying north-westward of S. W. Vernon Island, Charence Strait:--

In ordinary weather, this conical buoy, and Henry Ellis reef buoy may be plainly seen from each other, thus facilitating the navigation. The red buoy on the south-east spit of East Vernon island, which disappeared in 1884, will not be replaced.

Men, vehicles, horses, and every person or thing employed in the conveyance of such Mails shall be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General.

The Postmaster General shall be previously informed by the Contractor of the name of every driver or other person entrusted with the custody of such Mails. In case any servant of the Contractor employed in connection with such Mail Service shall be dismissed for misconduct or neglect, the name of such servant shall be forthwith reported to the Postmaster General, and the servant so dismissed shall not be eligible for re-employment in such service without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall not assign the benefit of any portion of his Contract without the sanction of the Postmaster General.

The Contractor shall be liable for the following penalty which shall be deducted, on the authority of the Postmaster General, from any amount falling due to him on account of his centract:—For conveyance by his servants or passengers, or other person, of any correspondence or matter liable to postage charge, without the permission or direction of the Postmaster General (unless under instructions as to roadside correspondence and loose bags), any sum not exceeding £3 for such offence.

All journeys which ought to commence on a day previous to the conclusion of the Contract, as well as all other Mail Services ensuing on the route, must be accomplished by the Contractor.

The Contractor must understand that no excuse for delay will be entertained unless supported by certificates from persons of known respectability as to the cause of delay and that it is not attributable to the absence of ample provision for efficiently carrying out the terms of the Contract.

The Mails must be conveyed at the rate of at least seven miles an hour, inclusive of stoppages.

The Contractor is required to convey loose letters given to him by any Postmaster for delivery on the road; and, unless specially exempted, shall, when applied to by any person on the road, receive letters for conveyance to the nearest Post Office.

The maximum fares that will be allowed to be charged are as follows :----

Between Spencer's Brook and Newcastle ... 7 Between Spencer's Brook and Northam ... 2 Between Newcastle and Northam ... 5

No Tenders will be entertained unless they bear the signatures of the Sureties.

If the Contractor shall fail in the performance of any one or more of the above conditions, the Postmaster General, in his discretion, may require the Sureties to complete, and they shall accordingly complete the contract at their own expense and risk in all things.

Where Mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, the Contractor will be required to provide an Officer of the Post or Telegraph Department with a free passage, if called upon to do so by the Postmaster General.

The Government will reserve to themselves the right to terminate the Contract at any time by giving three months notice.

Two approved Sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties required to be performed.

The Government do not bind themselves to accept the lowest or any Tender.

Special Forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Resident Magistrates and Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

Colonial and Indian Exhibition, 1886.

A ROYAL Commission, of which His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has been pleased to assume the Presidency, having been appointed for the purpose of organising and carrying out in London, during the year 1886, an Exhibition of the products, manufactures, and resources of the Colonial and Indian Empire, and a memorandum explaining fully the purposes of this Exhibition having, by order of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, been furnished for general guidance, with an invitation to this Government to join in bringing prominently under notice the development and progress of this Colony, His Excellency the Administrator, in order to carry out this object, has appointed a Commission for the purpose of collecting and forwarding such exhibits as will form a true and thorough representation of the industries, &c., of the Colony. At no period in its history has an Exhibition of this nature been of greater importance to its interests, both in regard to the present and the future.

During the past few years Western Australia has been attracting the attention of capitalists and others, as is evidenced by the various schemes for its development which have lately been prominently before the public.

It is therefore desirable that every endeavor should be made to have our resources fully represented.

The efforts of the Commission will be futile, unless seconded by the general public; it is therefore hoped that every assistance will be given, so that the exhibits of the industries, manufactures, and resources of the country may be of such a number and character as to render the Western Australian Court a success.

The space allotted to this Colony is ample, being 140 feet in length by 62ft. 6in. in breadth.

In order to secure a wide and complete representation, Sectional Committees have been organised, who will devote themselves more particularly to special subjects, viz.:

- Section 1.—*Staple Products*—Comprising wool, timber, pearl and pearl shells, tortoise shell, sandalwood, guano, gums, furs, copper, lead, and other minerals, &c.
- Section 2.—Colonial Industries—Agriculture, horticulture, preserves (fish, fruits, &c.), oils, wines, &c.
- Section 3.—Arts and Manufactures—Manufactures generally, including cases for exhibition, marble, stone work, &c.
- Section 4.—*Education and Science*—Statistics, history, geography, topography, anthropology, ethnology (aboriginals), botany, zoology, conchology, meteorology, &c.

The cost of transport within the Colony, together with the conveyance of the Exhibits to London, will be borne from the funds provided.

Local Committees for the collection of Exhibits will shortly be formed in every district.

Intending Exhibitors should communicate at an early date to the Secretary of the Commission, Perth, the full particulars of such Exhibits as they may desire to send.
