NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 78.
AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.
MORETON BAY.

(1) MIDDLE CHANNEL SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

The Government of Queensland has given Notice, dated 7th February 1885, that in consequence of recent changes in East and Venus banks, approach to Moreton Bay from the northward, vessels should not use Middle channel until further Notice.

KEPPEL BAY.

(2) FITZROY RIVER ENTRANCE—ADDITIONAL LEADING LIGHTS.

Also, that on 17th February 1885, the following additional leading lights would be exhibited at Fitzroy River entrance, Keppel Bay :—

1. Two fixed white lights on Balaklava island, placed 1763 yards apart, elevated 30 and 87 feet above the sea respectively, and which kept in line bearing S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. lead just westward of Timandra bank buoy.

Approximate position of northern light, lat. 23° 33' S., long. 150° 57' E.

2. Two fixed lights—the northern red, the southern white—on the western shore of Port Alma, southward of Eupatoria Point; these lights, elevated 25 and 54 feet above the sea respectively, and 860 yards apart, kept in line bearing S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. lead through Sea reach, in not less than 19 feet at low water; and to Port Alma, the line passing close to the position of Elbow light-vessel, and cutting the line of the leading lights on Balaklava Island in 7 fathoms water.

3. Two fixed lights—the western red, the eastern white—on Cardigan point, Balaklava island. These lights, elevated 25 and 52 feet above the sea respectively, and 850 yards apart, lead on a West (southerly) course northward of Elbow light-vessel, and into Rocky point reach, abreast Flat island.

The illuminating apparatus of these lights is catoptric, or by lenses.

DIRECTIONS BY NIGHT.—After rounding Timandra bank buoy, open the upper light on Balaklava island slightly westward of the lower light, and keep them so until the obscured sector of the light on Little Sea hill is passed; then open the upper light slightly eastward of the lower light, and keep them in that position until the lights on Eupatoria point are nearly in line, then steer for them, and bring them in line, this course then leads to a position just below the new Government wharf at port Alma.

Proceeding up Fitzroy river—after bringing Eupatoria point lights in line, keep them so until the red and white lights on Cardigan point are coming in line, then alter course and proceed with them in that position until the steep bank of the channel in Rocky Point reach is neared, when that shore is to be kept aboard, and the channel followed.

NOTE.—Elbow light-vessel will shortly be removed; the elbow of the bank will then be marked by a red buoy carrying a cage.

FIJI ISLANDS—VIII LEVU.

(3) SUVA HARBOUR—FIXED LIGHT ON QUEEN'S WHARF.

The Government of the Fiji islands has given Notice, that on 7th January, 1885, a light would be exhibited from the inner angle of Queen's wharf, Suva harbour :—

The light is a fixed light, showing green over the harbour, and white in shore over the wharf.

(The bearings and course are Magnetic. Variation 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ Easterly in 1885.)
