FINDING of the Court of Inquiry held at the Custom House, Fremantle, on the 25th August, 1885, into the circumstances attending the stranding of the British

schooner "Spinaway" (No. 68922) in Gage's Roads, in the Port of Fremantle, on the 18th August, 1885.

It is to be regretted that the Master was not on board at the time of the casualty, and we are of opinion that masters should not leave their vessels during stormy weather, in the Port of Fremantle, and therefore we censure Mr. Garrick, the Master of the "Spinaway."

The Mate (who holds a British Certificate of Competency as Master Mariner) did all that could have been done in this case.

We are of opinion that the warp passed from the "Sketty Belle" to the "Spinaway" did not in any way contribute to the parting of the first cable, and that it was intended for mutual protection in case of need, but was not tightened or used at all.

IRWIN ROADS BOARD.

A road 1 chain wide starting from Reserve 230 A at Strawberry Post Office, and extending in direction 219° 38' to a spot 5 chains East from the East boundary of location 948 at 13 chains 58 links North from its South-east corner; thence in a West-south-westerly direction through said location 948 to the South-east corner of location 1377; thence in the same direction through S.O.L.'s. $\frac{1}{100}$, 2055, location 793, S.O.L.'s. $\frac{1}{100}$ and 1105 to the South-east corner of location 872 at "Milo;" thence West along the South side of that location's South boundary and North along its West boundary to the South-east corner 1343, thence West along that location's South boundary about 24 chains (at which point a road branches off in a South-easterly direction), from thence in a North-westerly direction through location 1343 and S.O.L. 1961 to the South-east corner of S.O.L. 2078, thence West along its South boundary to its South-West corner, thence in a North-westerly direction passing through S.O.L.'s. 1289, 1290, and 2320, to the East boundary of S.O.L. 1424, thence West passing along the South boundary of location 483 to a spot near the left bank of the Irwin River (from which spot another road branches off southwards), and from thence crossing the Irwin River, in a North-westerly direction, to the road running through Yardarino Reserve.

LEADING LIGHTS, JOHNSTONE RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after this date the following Lights will be exhibited between sunset and sunrise at the Johnstone River, to enable vessels to navigate the entrance at night:—

Two white lights are placed, one on Flying Fish Point, the other on the shore on the further side of the bight of the river, which, when in line on a W. by N. bearing, lead across the outer Bar.

A green light is placed on the southern extremity of the rocks off Flying Fish Point.

At the Pilot Station are placed a red and a white light, which, when in line on a S.W. by W. bearing, lead across the Flats between Flying Fish and Coquette Points.

Directions:—To enter at night, cross the Bar with the two Leading Lights in line on a W. by N. bearing, and, when the water deepens, haul up for the green light on the rocks and pass it at a distance of 50 feet; then follow along the Flying Fish Point shore, and bring the red and white lights in line, crossing the Flats towards Coquette Point. When the water deepens and the Point is approached, proceed up the river as formerly.

- *8. From Bunbury to Balbarrup, *via* Dardanup, Preston, Balingup, and Bridgetown, and *vice versa*, in a four-wheeled spring vehicle, once a week.
