By His Excellency Sir George Cumine Strahan, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A. PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS I, SIR GEORGE CUMINE STRAHAN, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, deem it probable that the importation of Sheep from the Colony of Western Australia may cause disease to be introduced into Tasmania: Now therefore I, SIR GEORGE CUMINE STRAHAN, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in the Executive Council, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Diseased Animals Importation Prevention Act" (47^o Victoria, No. 2, Section 3), absolutely prohibit the importation into Tasmania of Sheep from the said Colony of Western Australia.

FROM THE GERALDTON MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

To His Excellency Sir F. N. Broome, K.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

Once more I have to thank you for the cordial manner in which you welcome Lady Broome and myself to Geraldton and the Victoria District, and to assure you that it gives us the greatest pleasure to come amongst you again, in response to the kind invitation conveyed to us through the representatives of the District in the Legislative Council.

Two days ago, I with much pleasure assented in Her Majesty's name to a law raising the corporation of this town to the dignity of a mayoralty, an event upon which I heartily congratulate Mr. Baston, the Chairman of the present Municipal Council, a gentleman who has done so much in the past for Geraldton, and who will now be the first of a long line of Mayors, under whom, I trust, the town may rapidly advance in wealth and importance.

Referring to your harbour, I think I may tell you, without any breach of confidence, that Sir John Coode gave me to understand, before he left this Colony, that he hoped to be able to make proposals which, at no unreasonable expense, will serve your trade in an efficient manner. With regard to inland conveniences, the construction of the Greenough Railway will very shortly be put in hand; and the district has thus before it a period of activity in public works which cannot fail to be very advantageous.
