Sir,—Adverting to your letter of the 5th ultimo (No.  $\frac{71}{86}$ ), I have the honor to forward herewith, for the information of your Government, transcript of a report indicating how far towards Eucla in this Colony rabbits are known to exist.

I may say that, practically speaking, there are no rabbits known within 300 miles of the western boundary of South Australia near Eucla.

From the vermin certificates received from Vermin Board, No. 44 (Fowler's Bay District), it is evident that there are no rabbits west of Pastoral Lease No. 2207, Laura Bay, which is situated just east of Denial Bay, and they are only found there in very limited numbers; but rabbits are plentiful in the adjoining District, No. 41 (Streaky Bay), large numbers having been destroyed in Kirkala, Chandada, and Weekra under the Vermin Act of 1884, and this destruction is being actively continued by the lessees of all the above-named runs. Laura Bay is approximately 304 miles east of Eucla, and to this can be added the distance from Laura Bay to Weekra, so that the actual distance from Eucla to where rabbits are plentiful in South Australia can be stated at 350 miles. The yearly advance of rabbits has been variously estimated at from 50 to 150 miles, but no fixed scale exists, as much depends on the climate and the nature of the country over which the rabbits pass.

### Fremantle Municipality.

#### "The Building Act, 1884."

##### BY-LAW No. 1.

###### License Fees, Secs. 5 and 6.

1. No person shall erect hoarding, or fence, or deposit any materials on the street or pavement without first obtaining a license from the Town Surveyor. The fees to be paid for such license shall be five shillings per month, or any part of a month. Any person offending against this By-Law shall incur a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every such offence.

##### BY-LAW No. 2.

###### Party Walls, Sec. 12.

2. All partitions between separate houses or other buildings erected or altered in future, whether such houses or other buildings shall belong to one or more owners, shall be of not less than 12" stone, or 9" brickwork, and shall entirely separate the woodwork of the two roofs; the said party walls shall be carried up at least 9" above iron roof, and 15" above shingled roof. Any person neglecting to comply with these provisions shall incur a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

##### BY-LAW No. 3.

###### To regulate the construction of Water Closets, Earth Closets, or Privies, Sec. 19.

3. Every house or other building shall have attached to it water closets, earth closets, or privies of the following construction: the size above floor to be not less than 4ft. x 5ft., and not less than 8ft. 6in. high on the lowest side; it must also have a stench pipe, at least 3" in diameter, to lead from seat through the roof 1' 6" above the same. The walls to be constructed of 4½" brickwork or 12" stonework, and not to be erected closer than 3 feet from boundary of grant. Cesspits for privies to be constructed of 12" stonework, or 9" brickwork, with 6" of concrete on bottom, to be 4ft. x 4ft. x 4ft. deep below the privy floor; the whole to be cemented and made thoroughly water-tight, and inspected and passed before being used. Any person violating any of these provisions shall incur a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

##### BY-LAW No. 4.

###### To regulate the size of Ashpits, Sec. 20.

4. All dwellings erected after the passing of the Act to have ashpits of the following dimensions: for cottages of 3 rooms and under, 3ft. x 2ft. x 4ft. deep, for villas 4 to 6 rooms, 4ft. x 3ft. x 4ft. deep, for houses 6 to 10 rooms, 6ft. x 4ft. x 4ft. deep, for houses 10 to 18 rooms, 8ft. x 5ft. x 4ft. deep. If such ashpits are not constructed, Council will construct at the expense of the owner, as provided by the Act.

MY LORD,

Government House, Perth, 11th December, 1885.

I have the honor to enclose to Your Excellency an extract from a newspaper of this Colony [*Daily News*, Saturday, October 10th, 1885], in which it is stated, on the authority of the *Bombay Gazette*, that a proposal has been made by Sir Frederick Roberts to send an annual Indian troopship, with military invalids, to these Colonies.

2. I would venture, as this question has been again raised, to solicit Your Excellency's attention to a suggestion made by me to Her Majesty's Government last year, that Western Australia should be used as a Sanatorium for the troops in India.

3. I enclose correspondence (Despatches 62 and 78, of 1884, with enclosure), which will show the reasons by which I supported my proposal. It was not at the time entertained; but it appears to me that it is worth further examination, in the interest of the lives of British soldiers, and their cost to the State.

4. It will be observed from the papers, I may first remark, that the question of the establishment of a military Sanatorium in this Colony was treated as identical with that of its establishment in the Colony of Tasmania. The two proposals are very different. In the first place, Fremantle (the port to which the invalids would come in this Colony) is nearer to India by a week's steaming than Hobart, a consideration which much reduces the cost of my proposal, and is otherwise greatly in favor of it. In the second place, the Tasmanian climate, healthy and admirable as it is in many respects, certainly possesses, at one time of year, an excess of wet and cold weather, which is absent from this part of Australia. The climate of Perth, I believe medical authority will support me in saying, would be far more suitable for Indian invalids than Tasmania.

5. I would next ask Your Excellency's attention to the statistics adverse to my proposal given by Surgeon-General Sir A. Home, in the enclosure to Major-General Johnson's letter of 13th October, 1884. These statistics were all that were accessible to Sir A. Home, and of course he could only use them. But it appears to me that they are conjectural and incomplete; and I submit that a question of importance and gravity, seriously affecting the health and lives of our soldiers, deserves consideration in the light of an exact and full knowledge of the actual and whole facts of the case.

6. Does it not stand to reason that the establishment of a Sanatorium for Indian troops close at hand in the kindly climate of Western Australia, in preference to sending invalids home, by the long Red Sea voyage to the hostile climate of England, would save the lives of a considerable number of British soldiers every year? I submit that it will be difficult to disprove this self-evident proposition.

7. Invalids are usually sent out of England, at least for the winter, when they can afford a journey. But sick troops from India have not only to face the severity of a climate which can kill a strong man, but they have to run the gauntlet of the Red Sea *en route*. The element of deaths on the voyage, I may here remark, requires to be considered.

8. Should Your Excellency think fit to cause this proposal to be carefully and fully examined, it is not impossible that a different conclusion may be arrived at from that which has been pronounced.

9. I think, also, that the extra cost involved in establishing a military invalid dépôt or Sanatorium in Western Australia (the experiment might be on a small scale at first) would not be very great when a careful balance was struck between the debit and credit sides of the account.

10. In conclusion, I commend to Your Excellency's attention the plain view of the whole matter, which is that the lives of a great number of Her Majesty's soldiers and subjects would be saved to themselves and their country in a very few years, if the sick men were spared the voyage through the Red Sea to the English climate, and were allowed, instead, a short and fine-weather passage to the unclouded and temperate sunshine of Western Australia.
