Whereas Gold in small quantities has been found in various parts of Western Australia, it is hereby notified, for general information, that the Local Government of Western Australia offer as a reward for the discovery of a workable Goldfield, within a radius of three hundred miles from any declared Port in the Colony, the sum of

£5,000,
