WESTERN AUSTRALIA—CHAMPION BAY.

GENTLEMEN,

In accordance with the request of His Excellency the Governor, Sir F. Napier Broome, made when I was in the Colony last year, I proceeded to Geraldton and made a personal examination of Champion Bay, with a view to the consideration of the best mode of providing improved accommodation for loading and discharging vessels at that place.

On arrival at Geraldton I was met by Mr. Baston, Chairman of the Municipal Council, Mr. Gale, Mr. A. H. du Boulay, Mr. Shenton, and other members of the Council; from these gentlemen I received the requisite local information, and by their courtesy and assistance was enabled to use to the greatest advantage the short time at disposal for my inspection. From Mr. Tapscott, Inspector in the Department of Public Works, valuable facts were obtained as to the supply and rates of materials and labor in the locality.

Accompanied by Mr. Baston I visited the Moore Point Lighthouse, and from the top thereof got a good general view of the Bay; as a strong westerly wind was blowing at the time, I was able to see for myself how well the inner part of the Bay is sheltered at such times by the reefs which extend in a northerly direction from Moore Point.

Notwithstanding the bad weather, I was also able to proceed to the site—inside the Inner Knoll Buoy—on which it has been proposed to construct a wharf.

To enable me to study the question, I was furnished, in addition to the published Admiralty charts of the coast and Bay, with a trace from Captain Archdeacon's survey of 1874. To supplement these, I left with the Honorable J. A. Wright, Director of Public Works, a memorandum of certain detailed technical information which I found to be required. This information has been supplied by Mr. Wright, and I now have the honor to submit my Report on the whole subject.

PREVIOUS PROPOSAL.

It has, I understand, been proposed that an open piled viaduct should start from the shore about half a mile to the westward of the present Jetty, and extend about 5,000 feet in a direction N.W. by N. Magnetic or thereabouts. Beyond this viaduct it was intended to construct a Wharf, alongside and under shelter of which vessels were to lie and discharge or load their cargoes.

Such a Wharf would be in the midst of water that would of necessity be greatly disturbed and broken during the prevailing westerly seas, and at the same time would have immediately to leeward the three patches of rock lying to the southward of the "Inner Knoll" buoy with $2\frac{3}{4}$, $1\frac{3}{4}$, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms respectively over them. The danger to which vessels approaching or leaving the wharf would be thus exposed would certainly cause their captains to decline to make use of the work in bad weather.

Again, the cost of construction of a wharf on such a site, and the expense due to the great length of the viaduct approach thereto, would entail a very large outlay, and, in my opinion, would not be a judicious expenditure of money either public or private.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

After careful consideration, I would recommend that a new Jetty should be constructed from the shore directly opposite Durlacher Street, somewhat less than 700 yards to the eastward of the existing Jetty. The direction of this new work should be N.N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. (Compass bearing), being the same as that of the existing Jetty. By the adoption of this direction and position vessels alongside the Jetty would be "end-on" to the run of the greatest sea disturbance coming into the Bay, and advantage would be taken of the nearest approach of deep water to the shore.

To secure sufficient length of berthage, with the necessary depth at low water of the lowest tides, the new jetty should be 830 feet long. This would afford accommodation which would be ample for a long time, inasmuch as the outermost half of its length would have a depth of from 2 to $2\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms at low water.

The present jetty is 700 feet long, measuring from the high water line on the beach; the depth along the outermost part is from $1\frac{1}{2}$ to $1\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, and to reach the 3 fathom line an extension of at least 2,500 feet would be necessary. On the line now recommended the total distance from high water line on the beach to the 3 fathom line is only 2,160 feet, as against 3,200 feet on the line of the existing work; I give these comparisons because I understood when at Geraldton that the extension of the existing jetty had been contemplated.

To illustrate my recommendation I have had the two accompanying Drawings prepared.

Drawing No. 1 is a copy of the Plan, prepared under the direction of Mr. Wright; it shows the foreshore of Champion Bay, between Francis and Lewis Streets, with the special soundings taken at my request.

Drawing No. 2 contains a plan of the proposed works and the foreshore in its immediate vicinity on a larger scale, also detail sections, &c., showing the mode of construction.

From these drawings it will be seen that my proposal is, as before mentioned, that the Jetty should start opposite the end of Durlacher Street, and should run parallel with the existing work. At or about the high water line the foreshore would be protected by a breastwork of close piling, extending the full width of the "Root," with returns at each end to prevent the breastwork from being outflanked by exceptionally high tides or storms.

The inner part of the Jetty for a length of 440 feet would be 30 feet wide, carrying two lines of Railway. Beyond this, the outer or working portion of the Jetty would be constructed, in length 360 feet, and 54 feet wide. Over this length, which is exclusive of the triangular head, there would be four lines of railway with cross over or connecting lines, thus enabling the discharge or loading of ships to be carried on simultaneously on both sides of the jetty without interruption to the traffic. The outer end would be finished off by a strong triangular head, on which the necessary leading light would be fixed. At the break between the inner and outer lengths a flight of boat steps would be provided.

The character of construction is shown in considerable detail in figures 3, 4, 5, and 6 on Drawing No. 2. From these views it will be seen that the structure would be of a very substantial character and would be practically formed of timber throughout.

The well known suitability of "Jarrah" or "Karri" for works of this description, prevents any question arising as to their use in this case—the estimates for the work have been calculated accordingly.

The system of railways and the warehouses shown on the drawings are those which appear to me to be best for the proper working of the Jetty, and for the special requirements of the site. For these purposes it is desirable that at least one block of land on each side of Durlacher Street should be acquired forthwith, although a portion only of the adjunct works need be constructed in the first instance. Before constructing warehouses on these sites it would probably be necessary to protect the foreshore by extending the breastwork at the inner end of the Jetty before referred to.

ESTIMATE.

I estimate the cost of the various works hereinbefore described as follows:—

Jetty with Piles and Superstructure of Jarrah or Karri, including root, breastwork, head, landing steps, fenders, bollards, and light, also the necessary bearers for carrying the railway lines as shown	14600

For rapid and economical working, at least one steam crane of special design should be provided for each side of the Jetty. The cranes should be capable of lifting goods from a ship's hold, and of loading them directly into trucks standing on the Jetty lines. In view of the small gauge of the Western Australian Railways the cranes should be fitted with arrangements by which they can be blocked up when working; their cost is not included in the foregoing estimate, but would be about £500 per crane, delivered on board ship in the Port of London.
