2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents, under the orders of the Director of Army Remount Operations for India.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 15th September to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th August. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breeds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

6. The average price for a Waler remount has been fixed at £50 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the current rate of exchange. The average price for all other remounts is Rs. 550. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed the above limits.

Order in Council.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under the 39th Victoria, No. 13.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of the Second Section of "The Pearl Shell Fishery Regulation Act, 1875," it is lawful for the Governor, in Council, from time to time to make regulations with regard, *inter alia*, to the provisioning of the ships employed in connection with diving for pearl shells: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, do make this Regulation in Executive Council, in pursuance of the said Act, namely:—

There shall be supplied to every person engaged in diving for or otherwise collecting pearl shells, who shall have been at sea for ten (10) days, as part of the provisioning of such persons, a daily ration of lime juice.

Such lime juice shall be inspected and approved by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident or by the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, or by some person deputed by a Collector of Customs or by a Government Resident, and after such inspection and approval there shall be added, in the presence of the approving officer, so much proper and palatable proof spirit as to amount to fifteen per centum of the whole.

For every five persons there shall be mixed five ounces of such lime juice and spirit with five ounces of sugar and three pints of water, to be served to and taken by the men at dinner.

Should any man refuse or neglect to drink the said mixture of such lime juice, spirit, sugar, and water, every such refusal or neglect must be entered in the official log book of the ship.

A BILL to amend "The Building Act, 1884."

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. THIS Act may be cited as "The Building Act Amendment Act, 1887."

Short title.

2. WHEREAS by the 3rd Section of "The Building Act, 1884," power is given to the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, under certain circumstances and in manner prescribed, to apply the provisions of the said Act *inter alia* to other portions of Perth and Fremantle than those to which it now applies, be it enacted that the notice in the *Government Gazette* in the said section mentioned shall take effect and come into operation six calendar months after the date of such notice.

Notice of extension of Act.

3. NO block of ground shall be laid out for building unless and until a plan showing clearly the number of houses proposed to be built and the area to be occupied by each house has been laid before and approved by the Municipal Council, and it shall be unlawful for the Municipal Council to approve of any plan which does not show that every proposed building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house, shall, unless all the rooms therein can be lighted and ventilated from a road, street, alley, or passage adjoining, have in the rear or on one side thereof an open space, exclusively belonging thereto, of the extent of at least square feet.

Plans of buildings to be approved by Municipal Council.

4. NO building intended to be or capable of being used as a dwelling house shall be allowed to be built higher than the floor level of the ground floor, unless and until the builder shall have satisfied the Municipal Council that such floor is so constructed or raised to such a height as to admit of a free current of air passing thereunder.

Ventilation of ground floors.

5. THE Municipal Council may at any time during or after the erection of any building give notice to the builder or owner thereof of any matter or thing in the construction of such building which tends to render such building insanitary, unsafe, or prejudicial to the public interest; and thereupon such builder or owner shall pull down or so alter or add to the said building as to remove the ground of objection, unless he with due diligence prosecute an appeal or bring an action as hereinafter mentioned.

Notice by Municipal Council of required alterations.

6. ANY builder or owner feeling aggrieved by any refusal to sanction, or any notice or order of the Municipal Council, may appeal therefrom to the Supreme Court by motion on notice duly given, or may bring an action at law against the Municipal Council in respect of any refusal to sanction, or notice or order of the said Council, and the usual incidents of litigation shall apply to such motion

Appeal.

or action. The Clerk of the Municipal Council shall be the person to receive notice of such motion or to be the defendant to such action, and should the Clerk as such person be ordered by the Court to pay costs or be cast in damages, such costs or damages shall be paid by the Municipal Council out of moneys raised by rates duly levied by them or by a rate levied for the purpose.

A BILL to prevent the bringing of Spirituous or Fermented Liquors on board Her Majesty's ships.

WHEREAS by any Act of the Imperial Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland it is made unlawful to bring Spirituous or Fermented Liquors on board Her Majesty's ships without the commander's consent: And whereas it is expedient, to promote discipline in Her Majesty's Navy, that the provisions of the said Act in that behalf be applied and extended to this Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Adoption of 16 and
17 Vict., cap. 69,
section 12.

1. THAT it shall not be lawful for any person to bring on board any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels any spirituous or fermented liquor of any description, without the previous consent of the officer commanding the ship or vessel on board of which the same may be brought; and it shall be lawful for any officer in Her Majesty's service, or warrant or petty officer of the Navy, or non-commissioned officer of marines, with or without seamen or persons under his command, to search any boat or vessel hovering about or approaching or which may have hovered about or approached any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels, and if any spirituous or fermented liquor be found on board such boat or vessel to seize such spirituous or fermented liquor, and the same shall be forfeited to Her Majesty; and if any person shall bring any spirituous or fermented liquor on board any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels without such previous consent as aforesaid, or shall approach or hover about any of Her Majesty's ships or vessels for the purpose of bringing any spirituous or fermented liquor on board the same, without such previous consent, or for the purpose of giving or selling, without such previous consent, spirituous or fermented liquor to men in Her Majesty's service, or of aiding or assisting any officer, seaman, or marine in Her Majesty's service to desert or improperly absent himself from his ship or vessel, every such person shall, upon a summary conviction thereof before a Justice or Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every such act or offence; and it shall be lawful for any officer in Her Majesty's service, or any such warrant or petty officer, or non-commissioned officer as aforesaid, or for any constable or peace officer, with or without any warrant or other process, to apprehend or cause to be apprehended any such offender or person so acting, and to bring him or cause him to be brought before any Justice or Justices of the Peace, for the purpose of having the offender summarily convicted of the same.

Application of fines.

2. THAT any fines paid by persons convicted under this Act shall be paid to the Colonial Treasurer as part of the public revenue of this Colony.

A BILL empowering the Governor in Executive Council to make Regulations as to the Conveyance of Animals by sea or land.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. THIS Act may be cited as “The Conveyance of Animals Act, 1887.” Short title.

2. IT shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make regulations in respect of the travelling, removal, transit, or conveyance of animals by sea and land, and as to any matters in connection therewith, and from time to time to alter, amend, or cancel the same. Regulations.

3. SUCH regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be laid before the Legislative Council at the next session thereof, but shall come into force at the date notified at the time of publication. Publication, &c.

A BILL to further amend “The Imported Stock Act, 1876,” and all other Acts amending the same.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the payment by the Importers of Fees to the Inspectors of Stock: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THAT this Act may be cited as “The Imported Stock Amendment Act, 1887.” Short title.

2. THAT any Inspector of Stock acting under the provisions of “The Imported Stock Act, 1876,” and any Acts amending or read therewith, or under the provisions of “The Imported Stock Amendment Act, 1885,” shall receive a fee of _____ per head on all great stock and of _____ per head on all small stock. Fees payable to Inspector of Stock.

3. THAT camels, horse stock, bulls, cows, oxen, bullocks, steers, heifers, calves, mules, and asses shall be reckoned as “great stock,” and any other stock which may be so defined by any order made by the Governor under “The Imported Stock Amendment Act, 1885.” Great stock.

4. THAT rams, ewes, wethers, lambs, goats, dogs, and swine shall be reckoned as “small stock,” and any other stock which may be so defined by any order made by the Governor under “The Imported Stock Amendment Act, 1885.” Small stock.

Importers to pay fees.

5. THAT all fees in the second section of this Act mentioned be paid and borne by the importers of stock.

Recovery of fees.

6. ALL fees payable under this Act may be recovered in a summary way before any two or more Justices of the Peace, on the complaint of an Inspector.

A BILL to repeal the 50th Victoriae, No. 21, being an Act which imposed a Duty upon Gold.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Repeal of 50th Vic., No. 21.

1. THAT the 50th Victoriae, No. 21, be and is hereby repealed.

No proceedings to be taken under repealed Act.

2. THAT no proceedings be taken or continued for the recovery of any duty, forfeiture, or penalty imposed by the said Act.

Quantity and value of gold to be declared.

3. THAT whereas it is desirable for public reasons to ascertain the quantity of gold which is exported from this Colony, all persons leaving the Colony having in their possession crude or unmanufactured gold, or gold ore, or gold dust, or articles manufactured of gold found in or procured from the soil of this Colony, shall declare at the Customs previous to exportation from this Colony the weight and estimated value of all such crude or unmanufactured gold, gold ore, gold dust, and of all articles manufactured as aforesaid.

Penalty for not declaring.

4. ANY persons leaving, attempting to leave the Colony, or to export any matter or thing in the last preceding section mentioned, without having made such declaration, shall be guilty of an offence, and upon summary conviction thereof be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

A BILL to amend the Law in respect of the employment of Prisoners sentenced to hard labor.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

Short title.

1. THAT this Act may be cited as “The Prisoners Employment Act, 1887.”

Repeal of sec. 24 of 12th Vic., No. 7.

2. THAT the twenty-fourth section of Ordinance No. 7 of the 12th Victoriae be and is hereby repealed, and such repeal shall take effect at the time of the commencement of this Act.

3. THAT any prisoner sentenced to penal servitude or to imprisonment with hard labor for any felony or misdemeanor for which he is legally liable to be sentenced to such imprisonment without the alternative of a fine, may be ordered by the keeper of the prison in which he shall be then confined to be set to work, and may be set to work on the roads or any public work beyond the precincts of the said prison. Any such prisoner so ordered to be set to work as aforesaid who, whether in charge of any gaoler or not, shall abscond, whether on the way from the prison to the place of work, or at the place of work, or on the way from the place of work to the prison, shall be liable to the penalties of an escape. Any such prisoner so set to work as aforesaid, either alone or with any other prisoner or prisoners, may be kept at such work in chains or otherwise secured as may be deemed expedient.

Certain prisoners may be set to work outside prison.

A BILL to amend the Law relating to Documentary Evidence.

WHEREAS the "Documentary Evidence Act, 1868," of the Imperial Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland is in force in this Colony, subject to any law that may from time to time be made by the Legislature of this Colony, and it is expedient to make such law: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. THAT this Act may be cited as "The Documentary Evidence Act, 1887." Short title.

2. THAT the provisions of the second sub-section of the second section, and of the first sub-section of the fourth section of the said Imperial Act shall apply not only to such proclamations, orders, or regulations as are printed under the authority of the Legislature of this Colony, but also to all proclamations, orders, regulations, and notices made or issued by the Governor under authority possessed by him, whether such proclamations, orders, regulations, and notices be or be not printed and published in the *Government Gazette*. Evidence of proclamations, &c.

3. THAT *prima facie* evidence of any proclamation, order, regulation, or notice made or issued after the passing of this Act by or under the authority of the Governor, or of the Governor in Executive Council, or of the Legislative Council, or of the Head of any Department of the Government, or of any Body or Board in the first column of the Schedule to this Act mentioned, may be given in all Courts of Justice and in all legal proceedings whatever by the production of a copy of or extract therefrom, such copy or extract purporting to be certified to be true by the person or persons specified in the second column of the said Schedule in connection with the officer, department, body, or board in the said first column mentioned. What persons may make official copies.

Act to be cumulative.

4. THAT the provisions of this Act shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in derogation from any powers of proving documents given by any Imperial Statute in force in this Colony, or by any Ordinance or Act in force in this Colony.

A BILL to amend "The Small Debts Ordinance, 1863."

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. THAT the magistrate's and clerk's fees charged in about the bringing in a local court of an action in which the amount sought to be recovered does not exceed five pounds, shall not be those contained in Schedule B to the said Act, but in lieu thereof a sum shall be charged and paid in respect thereof, varying with the amount sought to be recovered, according to the following scale:—

Reduction of Fees in actions for sums not exceeding £5.


When the sum sought to be recovered does not exceed ten shillings	There shall be paid in lieu of such magistrate's and clerk's fees a fee of one shilling.
Exceeds ten shillings but does not exceed a pound	} Two shillings.
Exceeds a pound but does not exceed one pound ten shillings	} Three shillings.
Exceeds one pound ten shillings but does not exceed two pounds	} Four shillings.
Exceeds two pounds but does not exceed two pounds ten shillings	} Five shillings.
Exceeds two pounds ten shillings but does not exceed three pounds	} Six shillings.
Exceeds three pounds but does not exceed three pounds ten shillings	} Seven shillings.
Exceeds three pounds ten shillings but does not exceed four pounds	} Eight shillings.

2. THAT notwithstanding any Act or Ordinance or any Rule of Court to the contrary, it shall be in the power of the magistrate of a local court to award costs to the plaintiff on the scale for actions brought for a sum exceeding twenty pounds on any amount recovered, however small, or to the defendant who successfully defends an action brought for any amount, however small, provided the said magistrate certify that the action involved some novel or difficult point of law, or that the question litigated was of importance to some class or body of persons, or of general or public interest.

Power of magistrate to certify for costs in certain cases.

3. THIS Act may be cited as "The Small Debts Act, 1887."
