**W**HEREAS SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania

A PROCLAMATION.

**W**HEREAS on the Fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania reserved a certain Bill passed by the Federal Council of Australasia, intitled “An Act to regulate the Pearl Shell and Beche-demer Fisheries in Australasian Waters adjacent to the Colony of Western Australia,” for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure: And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and has been assented to by Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council: Now therefore I, SIR ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of “The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885,” (48 and 49 Victoria, Cap. 60, Section 19), and in exercise of the powers thereby vested in me, do hereby notify and proclaim that the said bill has received the Assent of Her Majesty.

AND WHEREAS the Bill in the said Proclamation mentioned is one affecting this Colony of Western Australia;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by the eighteenth and nineteenth sections of the Imperial Statute, “The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885,” that any Bill which shall have been passed by the Federal Council of Australasia and shall have received Her Majesty's Assent thereto, shall be proclaimed in any Colony affected thereby:

NOW THEREFORE I, Sir Malcolm Fraser, K.C.M.G., Administrator as aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation publishing the above recited Proclamation proclaim the Assent of Her Majesty to the said Bill, and I hereby command all persons to take notice hereof, and to govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Second Section of "The Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time and at any time, by Proclamation published in the Western Australian *Government Gazette*, to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands, to be holden at such times and places, and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamation; and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time, or place, or manner of holding any such Courts; AND WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient to alter, as hereinafter specified, the time for holding the Local Court at Northam; NOW THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, in exercise of such power, do hereby notify and proclaim that the day for holding a Local Court for the recovery of Small Debts shall, after the 13th day of February instant and thenceforth, be the first Thursday in each month.

Proclamation by His Excellency The Right Honorable CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

WHEREAS by section ten of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction

of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd May, 1888, pursuant to the provisions of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things Scab in Sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease: And whereas there is reason to believe that Scab at the present time exists in sheep both in the Colony of New Zealand and also in the Colony of Western Australia: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, absolutely prohibit for a further period of twelve months from the date of this Proclamation, the importation or introduction of any sheep, or any fodder or fittings put on board any vessel with, or for the use of, any sheep from either of the Colonies of New Zealand or of Western Australia.
