WHEREAS the Legislative Council now stands prorogued until Tuesday, the 18th instant; AND WHEREAS it is expedient further to prorogue the same; Now THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, in exercise of the powers in me vested, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Legislative Council from Tuesday, the 18th day of March, to Tuesday, the 22nd day of April next ensuing, unless sooner convened for the despatch of business.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the 43rd year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 23, intituled "An Act for the prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," the Governor, with the

advice of the Executive Council, is empowered by Proclamation to prohibit the Importation of Stock, and to make, alter, or annul Regulations for regulating the conditions upon which Stock may be introduced into the Colony; AND WHEREAS various Proclamations and Regulations have from time to time so been issued; AND WHEREAS it is expedient to annul all such Proclamations and Regulations as may now be in force as regards Horses, Horned Cattle, Sheep, and Swine, and to make fresh Regulations for governing the Importation of such and other Animals into the Colony: Now THEREFORE I, the Administrator, in exercise of the powers possessed by me under the said Act and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, annul all such Proclamations and Regulations as may be in force with respect to the Importation of Horses, Horned Cattle, Sheep, and Swine into the Colony; and, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulations for governing the Importation of certain Animals into Western Australia:—

1. No horned cattle, sheep, or swine shall be introduced into the Colony of Western Australia, unless the owner or person in charge of such stock shall have in his possession a certificate from an Inspector of Stock, or other officer duly qualified, or person performing similar duties, at the port or place where such horned cattle, sheep, or swine were shipped on board the ship or vessel bringing the same into the Colony, issued within seven days of the departure of such ship or vessel from the port or place of embarkation, and certifying that such horned cattle, sheep, or swine (as the case may be) are free from disease; and unless a duplicate of such certificate shall have been forwarded by post forthwith, after the shipment of such stock, to the Colonial Secretary, at Perth. All such stock shall perform ninety days quarantine on arrival.

2. All horses imported into the Colony of Western Australia from any place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies shall be accompanied by a similar certificate, and be inspected by an appointed Veterinary Surgeon and an Inspector of Stock be-

fore being allowed to land, and shall perform 14 days quarantine.

3. If any person shall desire to introduce any such Stock by sea into this Colony without the before-mentioned certificate, the Governor or any other person appointed for the purpose by the Governor may, upon application, permit such Stock to be landed in quarantine. The duration of such quarantine shall in that case be for the term of 21 days for horses, and 120 days for horned cattle, sheep, and swine.

4. Camels, Deer, Antelopes, and Goats shall be inspected by a Veterinary Surgeon and an Inspector of Stock before landing, and if found suffering from Scabies quarantined and dressed until cured.

5. All Stock arriving suffering from any infectious or contagious disease excepting Scab shall at once be destroyed; one diseased animal to be conclusive evidence that all on board are diseased.

BURNETT RIVER.

DIRECTIONS FOR SOUTH CHANNEL ACROSS BAR.

THE following directions should be followed by vessels crossing the Burnett Bar by the South Channel:—

Steer for the Southern Cottage at the Pilot Station, and when the outer red buoy is picked up, pass it on the star-board hand. Then steer for the outer extremity of Barubra Island, passing a black buoy on the port hand, and continue this course until the Bar beacons are coming into line, when haul up, and proceed as formerly.

The depth shown by the tidal signals is that on the old line of cutting, with the leading beacons and lights in line.

The depth in the South Channel is 3 feet greater than that shown by signal.


