WHEREAS by a certain Deed Poll of Grant under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the Colony, the land hereinafter

mentioned, that is to say, *Canning Location No. 25*, was granted to John Morgan on the 28th day of May, 1834; AND WHEREAS by the said deed of grant power was reserved to the Crown to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said land which it might at any time by the Crown be deemed necessary to resume for making roads, canals, bridges, towing paths, or other works of public utility or convenience; AND WHEREAS the piece of land hereinafter described, parcel of the land hereinbefore mentioned, is required for the purpose of a Landing on Bull's Creek; NOW KNOW YE that Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, doth hereby, and by virtue of the said power and authority reserved and contained in the said Deed Poll of Grant, resume, for the purpose aforesaid, ALL that piece or parcel of land described in the Schedule hereto. IMPORTED STOCK ACT OF 1871 AND THE IMPORTED STOCK ACT AMENDMENT ACT OF 1884.

QUARANTINE AND DRESSING OF AUSTRALIAN IMPORTED SHEEP.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to cancel so much of the Regulations of 22nd May, 1888, issued under the abovenamed Acts, relating to the Quarantine and Dressing of Australian Sheep imported from a clean Colony, as will admit of sheep from Tasmania, and intended to be offered at the sales of Stud Sheep in Sydney, arriving by special steamer in the charge of their owners or their servants, being introduced into this Colony, if found on inspection to be free from disease, without being subject to quarantine or dressing.

SIR,

Perth, March 11th, 1890.

I have the honor to report to you that, acting in accordance with the tenor of your letter of the 22nd of January, requesting me to attend, on behalf of this Colony, the Conference between Members of the Federal Council and Delegates from the Governments of New South Wales and New Zealand, appointed to meet in Melbourne on the 4th of February, to consider the great question of a Federal Government for Australasia, I at once proceeded to Melbourne, arriving there on the 1st of February, where I was officially informed that the meeting of the Conference had been postponed until the 6th of February, in order to permit of the arrival of the New Zealand delegates before the proceedings commenced.

I was also informed, at the same time, that the Standing Committee of the Federal Council had finally decided not to advise the Governor of Tasmania to summon a meeting of that body for this year; but the question of the Defence of King George's Sound, which you requested me to bring under the notice of the Federal Council, has not been shelved in consequence of no Session being held, but has been satisfactorily dealt with, as I will proceed to relate later on.

The Conference met for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 6th of February, all the Australasian Colonies being represented, with the exception of Fiji.

Mr. Gillies, the Premier of Victoria, having been unanimously elected President, Sir Henry Parkes at once tabled the following resolution:—

“That in the opinion of this Conference, the best interests, and the present and future prosperity of the Australian Colonies will be promoted by an early union under the Crown; and while fully recognizing the valuable services of the Members of the Convention of 1883, in founding the Federal Council, it declares its opinion that the seven years which have since elapsed have developed the national life of Australia in population, in wealth, in the discovery of resources, and in self-governing capacity to an extent which justifies the higher act, at all times contemplated, of the Union of these Colonies, under one Legislative and Executive Government, on principles just to the several Colonies.”

This abstract resolution, entering into no details, and affording no guide as to the form of Federal Government proposed, gave rise to a debate lasting for four days, and was eventually unanimously agreed to; though had it not been followed up by some resolutions brought forward by Mr. Deakin, to give practical effect to Sir Henry Parkes' proposal, the result of the Conference would not much have advanced the cause of Federation.

Mr. Deakin's resolutions were as follows:—

1st.—“That the Members of the Conference should take such steps as may be necessary to induce the Legislatures of the several Colonies to appoint, during the present year, Delegates to a National Australasian Convention, empowered to consider and report upon an adequate scheme for a Federal Constitution.”

2nd.—“That the Convention should consist of not more than seven Members from each of the self-governing Colonies, and not more than four Members from each of the Crown Colonies.”

These two resolutions were also carried unanimously. These resolutions contemplate, if possible, the election of Delegates by the respective Legislatures this year; but it was generally understood that the proposed Convention would not meet until the beginning of next year.

I trust, myself, that the various Colonies will consent to elect Delegates to meet and discuss this question of a Federal Union, in order, if possible, to devise some scheme whereby a Federal Government may be established, to administer such matters of mutual Australasian interests as it may be considered expedient to entrust to it, on principles just to the several Colonies.

There are, however, many difficulties, principally of a fiscal and financial character, to be surmounted before such a desirable end can be accomplished, and I venture to think that, unless very exceptional consideration was extended to this Colony, we should find it impossible to join a Federal Union, on the contemplated condition of having to relinquish to the Federal Government all our Customs duties, that portion of our revenue forming one half of our total revenue; and the abolition of all inter-colonial Customs duties would not be received with favor by the producing portion of our population.

These, though matters of detail, are the very essence of any scheme for a Federal Government, which will have to be considered by these Delegates, and the conclusion at which they may arrive will finally have to be submitted to and approved, or rejected, by the Legislatures of all the Colonies, so that ample means will be afforded for deliberation and discussion before any irrevocable decision is arrived at.

After the formal proceedings of the Conference had closed, I determined to make an effort before the Members separated to get a meeting convened, to come to some determination about the suggestions which had been made for the Fortification of King George's Sound and Thursday Island. The Minister of Defence in Victoria strongly supported my efforts in this direction, and a meeting was eventually arranged at which the Ministers representing all the Colonies were present; and it was unanimously agreed that the proposals made by the Imperial Government—which were approved of by the Legislative Council of this Colony at its last session—should be accepted and acted upon, with the exception that the forts should be manned by Colonial troops instead of by Marines, as suggested by Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies.

The Minister of Defence for Victoria, however, stated that there was a strong feeling amongst the Commandants of the military forces in the Colonies that, whilst the guns and fortifications as recommended by the Imperial Government were sufficient for the protection of Princess Royal Harbor and the town of Albany, they were wholly inadequate to prevent an enemy's cruiser from making use of King George's Sound as a base for warlike operations; and General Tulloch, who had recently been at Albany, was of opinion that one or two large guns should be mounted on Breaksea Island, and a small garrison kept there. After some discussion, it was finally decided that the Commandants of the military forces in the various Colonies, together with a Captain in the Navy (to be nominated by the Admiral of the Australian Squadron), should personally inspect King George's Sound and Thursday Island, and make a report as to the most efficient means of fortifying those two places.

I stated that, whilst agreeing to this proposal, it must be understood that if it was determined to increase the defences at the Sound in the manner suggested by General Tulloch, this Colony must not be expected to contribute more than it had already agreed to, and this view was generally acquiesced in by all present, who expressed their sense of the handsome manner in which we had already come forward with our contribution.

It is a source of much satisfaction to me, and I think it will be to the Colony at large, to know that the defence of King George's Sound—about which we have been agitating for so long—is at last within a reasonable distance of being an accomplished fact.

Trusting that I may have performed the duties committed to me at the late Conference to your satisfaction, and that the result will be beneficial to the Colony which I had the honor to represent,

**T**ENDERS (endorsed Tender for "Trucking at Bunbury") will be received at this Office until noon of Thursday, the 27th March instant, from persons willing to undertake the trucking on the Bunbury Jetty from 1st April to 31st December, 1890, in accordance with the undermentioned terms and conditions:—

*Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.*

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetty, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.
2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.
3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetty after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.

7. The Contractor and his servants to be amenable to the existing Jetty Regulations.

8. The Contractor not to be compelled to load trucks with goods placed more than three yards from the rails, nor to place goods discharged from trucks more than three yards from the rails; if a further distance is required, a special arrangement may be made with the owner of the goods.

9. For performing the above services the Contractor will be permitted to charge one shilling and sixpence per ton, as per scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881, on all goods trucked to and from the sea and shore end of Jetty.

10. For goods trucked after hours, on holidays (on permission being obtained for so doing from the Principal Officer of Customs or Officer in charge of jetty), the contractor will not be allowed to charge more than 2s. 6d. per ton, but he will be permitted to make special arrangements with parties requiring his services.

11. A bond of £100, with two sureties in similar amounts, will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Contract to terminate at any time on the Government giving one month's notice.

12. When the Jetty needs repair such as to interfere with the traffic, the trucking must be done in a way most advantageous under the circumstances, and no remission of rent will be made.

13. The Principal Officer of Customs to have the right to settle all disputes between truckers and owners of goods, and to fix and determine charges for trucking such goods on which dispute may hereafter arise, whether fixed or not by any previous scale for calculating tonnage.

14. The Principal Officer of Customs' decision in all such matters to be final, so far as they do not interfere with the laws existing in the Colony.

15. These conditions are to be signed by the tenderer and his sureties, on notice of acceptance of tender.
