To His Excellency the Governor, Western Australia.

A magnetic shoal has been found in latitude twenty (20) degrees thirty-two (32) minutes thirty-five (35) seconds dec. 5 seconds S., longitude hundred and seventeen (117) degrees thirteen (13) minutes two (2) seconds E., directly in the track of vessels bound from Cossack to Southern ports; depth eight (8) fathoms, sand bottom. Compasses are deflected fifty-five (55) degrees to the right and twenty-three (23) degrees to the left when passing the focus. The focus or spot of greatest magnetic attraction is fifty (50) feet in diameter. From it Bezout Island summit bears (true) S. seventy-nine (79) degrees twenty-five (25) minutes W., distant two (2) dec. fourteen (14) miles from Jarman Island Lighthouse; S. two (2) degrees forty (40) minutes E. (true), distant six (6) dec. fifty-two (52) miles. The area of shoal is about one (1) square mile, angle subtended by the extremes of Bezout Island sixteen (16) degrees at the focus. Probably there are many more of these magnetic shoals. I recommend that information be published in the *Gazette*, and that intelligence from shipmasters be invited to aid in the discovery of all such insidious dangers to navigation.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following By-Laws passed by the Kojonup Commonage Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Commonage.

JOHN FORREST,
Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. That the sum of (5s.) five shillings per head per annum be charged for all horses and cattle running on the Commonage; foals and calves at foot chargeable at the same rate.

That sheep be excluded from the Commonage, excepting sheep for killing purposes. That sheep for killing purposes be paid for at the rate of (1s.) one shilling per head per annum. Butchers and private houses not to exceed (50) fifty head.

Goats and pigs to be excluded from the Commonage.

2. That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock situated within the Kojonup townsite, and making use of the Commonage, to give a correct list of horses, cattle, sheep, he or they intend to run during the year, and to obtain from the Kojonup Roads Board, or the lessee of the Commonage, a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

3. That all arrears in respect of Commonage fees remaining unpaid for three months after they have become due shall be sued for by the Board in the Local Court.

4. All fees and fines recovered shall be for and on account of the Kojonup Roads Board.

5. That the only persons exempt from these rules shall be *bonâ fide* drovers travelling stock, and teams or packers travelling; drovers to be allowed to remain free of charge on the Commonage for not exceeding 24 hours, teams (1) one week, packers 48 hours. Should they remain over the time allowed they are liable to be charged (5s.) five shillings per week per head for horses and cattle, and (3d.) three-pence per head per week for sheep.

6. That stray stock from adjoining runs, if proved to be accidentally on the Commonage, shall be liable only to poundage and trespass fees if at once removed.

7. These rules shall not apply to horses or cattle in the employment of the Government.

A BEACON has been erected on Hummock Island, near the Pelsart Group of Houtman's Abrolhos, on the same site as the former beacon. It is of wood, colored black, and is 16 feet high, of pyramid shape—probably visible from a ship's deck about eight miles. For vessels proceeding through the Geelvink Channel, and getting too much to the Westward, this is a good mark.

From the danger called "Mid Reef," which is about half-a-mile long, East and West, and two cables wide, and of which the Eastern portion is nearly awash—Moore Point Lighthouse bears E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., distant $22\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Hummock Island beacon W.S.W., distant $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The whole of the supply to be of unexceptional quality, and subject to approval or rejection by officers or persons duly deputed by the Government.

The Flour to be warranted to keep good for six months after delivery.

Fresh meat to be delivered daily, when the Government or its representative may consider it practicable, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The Government reserves the right to cancel the contract for Meat at the end of March, 1891.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 1½lb.; or Onions, 1½lb., for every pound of Potatoes.

All supplies must be delivered in good and sound packages; Flour sacks will be returned to the Contractors; other packages will be retained free of charge.

Conditions of the Work to be performed and Rates to be charged by Contractor for Trucking.

1. The Contractor to perform all the trucking to and from the shore end of the Jetties, and to find labor for loading and discharging the trucks. Trucks will be found by the Government, and kept in repair except when damaged through carelessness.

2. The Contractor to be responsible for all loss or damage during transit, and in loading or discharging goods from the trucks.

3. The Contractor to place and stow all goods as directed by the Customs Officer in charge of the sea and shore end of the Jetty.

4. All the trucking to be charged per ton and be computed in accordance with the scale published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November, 1881.

5. When the trucking is ordered by the Principal Officer of Customs after the usual hours, during holidays, and on Sundays, the work must be performed by the Contractor.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.

The present scale of fees is as follows:—

For each boy over 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £3 6s. 8d. per term.

For each boy under 12 years of age on the first day of the term, £2 13s. 4d. per term.

In the case of two or more brothers attending the school, a reduction of 10 per cent. will be allowed in the fees for tuition.

The fees for each resident boarder are at the rate of £60 per annum for a boy over 12 years of age, and £50 per annum under 12 years, inclusive of the tuition fee.

Boys are received from the age of eight years and upwards.

Scholarships.

There are two High School Scholarships of the annual value of £50, open to competition by boys from any of the Elementary Schools.

Terms and Vacations.

The year is divided into 3 terms, with vacations of 6 weeks at Christmas; 1 week at Easter, during which it is optional for boarders to remain at the School without additional charge; and 5 weeks at Midwinter.

The School reassembles for the September term this day.
