PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE FIRST SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on TUESDAY, THE THIRTIETH DAY OF DECEMBER INSTANT, at the hour of twelve of the clock AT NOON: the session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Building lately known and used as the General Post Office, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Chambers heretofore used by the late Legislative Council, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, at Government House, this twelfth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety.
