CIRCULAR.

Downing Street,
1st February, 1892.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Queen expressing Her Majesty's deep sense of the loyalty and affectionate sympathy evinced by Her subjects in every part of Her Empire on the sad occasion of the death of Her Grandson, His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, K.G., eldest son of Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales.

I have also the honor to enclose a copy of a telegram, dated Windsor Castle, the 20th of January, in which Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales express to Her Majesty's subjects, whether in the United Kingdom, in the Colonies, or in India, the sense of their deep gratitude for the universal feeling of sympathy manifested towards them on the sad occasion of the loss of their beloved eldest son.

I have no doubt that both these touching documents have been already published in the Colony under your Government, but I have thought it right

that they should be communicated to you officially for record in the archives of the Colony.

The following letter from The Queen has been received by the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Home Department:—

Osborne, January 26th, 1892.

I must once again give expression to my deep sense of the loyalty and affectionate sympathy evinced by my subjects in every part of my Empire on an occasion more sad and tragical than any but one which has befallen me and mine, as well as the Nation. The overwhelming misfortune of my dearly loved Grandson having been thus suddenly cut off in the flower of his age, full of promise for the future, amiable and gentle, and endearing himself to all, renders it hard for his sorely stricken Parents, his dear young Bride, and his fond Grandmother to bow in submission to the inscrutable decrees of Providence.

The sympathy of millions, which has been so touchingly and visibly expressed, is deeply gratifying at such a time, and I wish, both in my own name and that of my children, to express, from my heart, my warm gratitude to all.

These testimonies of sympathy with us, and appreciation of my dear Grandson, whom I loved as a Son, and whose devotion to me was as great as that of a Son, will be a help and consolation to me and mine in our affliction.

My bereavements during the last thirty years of my reign have indeed been heavy. Though the labors, anxieties, and responsibilities inseparable from my position have been great, yet it is my earnest prayer that God may continue to give me health and strength to work for the good and happiness of my dear Country and Empire while life lasts.

“The Prince and Princess of Wales are anxious to express to Her Majesty's subjects, whether in the United

Kingdom, in the Colonies, or in India, the sense of their deep gratitude for the universal feeling of sympathy manifested towards them at a time when they are overpowered by the terrible calamity which they have sustained in the loss of their beloved eldest son.

"If sympathy at such a moment is of any avail, the remembrance that their grief has been shared by all classes will be a lasting consolation to their sorrowing hearts, and, if possible, will make them more than ever attached to their dear country."

Sir,—With reference to your letter of the 12th ultimo, and to previous correspondence, relative to the entry of men and boys of Australian, New Zealand, and Tasmanian birth in the Royal Navy, I am commanded by my Lords Commanders of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the enclosed draft of a small pamphlet, similar in form to that relating to the entry of boys 2nd Class for the Royal Navy in this country, contains the information which should be given to Candidates for entry on the Australian Station, observing that a supply of these pamphlets will be forwarded to the Commander-in-Chief on the Australian Station, who will communicate with the Colonial Governments when he receives the pamphlets.

2. My Lords do not at present propose to name a limit to the number of entries which may be made annually, thinking it best to first ascertain by experience whether qualified candidates will present themselves.

3. My Lords consider that details as to time and place of entry and the distribution of the pamphlets to candidates only on application should be settled between the Colonial Governments and the Commander-in-Chief of the Squadron on the Australian Station.

Regulations for the Control and Management
of the Pearl Shell Fishing at Sharks Bay.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), has been pleased to make the following Regulations for the control and management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery:—

1. The rent for General Licenses shall be £8 per annum for each boat, payable in advance, and no license shall be issued for less than £2.

2. All General Licenses granted under these Regulations shall be computed from the 1st of January preceding the date of issue, and the rent shall be calculated as from the 1st of January to the 31st December, and shall be paid to the Inspector. General licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent from the beginning of the quarter previous to the date of application, viz., from 1st day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, as the case may be.

3. Any person collecting, removing, destroying, or found in possession of immature shell shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

4. The holder of a General License shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat, but if more are re-

quired the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary, and if obtained an additional fee of 10s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.

5. It shall be lawful for the Inspector by notice in writing to the holders of General Licenses to prohibit the collection and removal of Pearl Shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year, the exact dates to be named in such notice. Any person offending against this Regulation shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

6. Applicants for general licenses shall give the name of the owner, and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.

7. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license. Any licensee offending against this provision shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

THE attention of Lessees of Mineral Lands, under Clause 82 of the Land Regulations of 1887, is called to Clause 2 of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892," now in force, and to Regulation No. 62 under said Act, published in the *Government Gazette* of 4th February, 1892, which are as follows:—

Clause 2—Mineral Lands Act, 1892.

2. (1.) So much of the Land Regulations proclaimed on the 2nd day of March, 1887, as are comprised in Part VI., Sections 80 to 92, inclusive, "Mineral Lands," are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect any rights, claims, or liabilities already accrued or incurred under those Regulations. Provided, however, that all mineral leases issued under those Regulations shall be subject in all respects to the labor conditions prescribed by this Act and the Regulations made under this Act.

*Regulation 62, under "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892."**Labor Conditions.*

62. All ground held under a mineral lease shall be worked by not less than one man for every five (5) acres or fraction of five (5) acres, unless exemption or partial exemption from work has been granted.

No. 1.—All that portion of Denham Sound lying between the shore of Dirk Hartog Island and a line drawn from Quoin Bluff to a headland lying South by West half South from Cape Bellefin.

No. 2.—All that portion of Useless Inlet and Freycinet Reach which lies inshore of a line extending Northwards from Cape Bellefin to the edge of the Three-fathom Bank on the 26th parallel South latitude, and along it East to a point about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles North-North-East from Cape Heirisson, and thence about South-South-East half South in direction of Lefevre Island to a spot $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles East from a headland lying about 5 miles North-Westerly from said island, and thence West to that headland.

No. 3.—All that portion of Denham Sound lying inshore of a line extending West from Cape Lesueur 3 miles, then South-South-Easterly to a spot 3 miles West from Lagoon Point, and then East to the said point.

No. 4.—All that portion of Hopeless Reach, Sharks Bay, lying between the shores of Faure Island, Peron Peninsula, and lines drawn from the North-Eastern shore of Faure Island to Cape Peron, and from the South end of Faure Island to the end of the Cliffs about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles South from Dubaut Point.
