Y virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44 Vict., No. 5), I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that from and after this date it shall not be lawful for any person to introduce into the Colony any Grapes or Grape Vines, nor shall it be lawful to introduce any Grape Vine Cuttings except such as are the produce of the Province of South Australia; and, before any such Grape Vine Cuttings are landed in the Colony, a certificate from some duly-qualified person, or a statutory declaration by the proprietors, declaring that the Vineyard from which the Cuttings were procured is free from disease, shall be produced to the Collector or Sub-Collector of Customs at the port of importation.

The Order in Council dated the 15th day of April, 1886, is hereby rescinded.

MOORADUNG ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

MOORADUNG ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a West line passing through the South boundary of Reserve 334 at the 54-mile tree on the Perth-Albany Road; on the East by the East side of said road, in a South-Easterly direction, to the South-East corner of Williams Location 144, near the Hotham River Bridge, then in a South-South-Westerly direction to the North-West corner of Reserve 605, near Quindaning, then along the West boundary of said reserve to its South-West corner; on the South by a West line from the South-West corner of Reserve 605 before mentioned; on the West by the Northern portion of a line from the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers to the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers, then by a North-North-Westerly line from last-mentioned junction towards the 41-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road to a spot due West 41-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road to a spot due West from the South boundary of Reserve 334 aforesaid. The Hotham River Bridge, on the Perth-Albany Road, is excluded from this District.

NARROGIN ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by the Hotham River upwards from the North-East corner of Reserve 907 near the York road crossing to Millinggnalling Pool, then by an Easterly line to Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range; on the West by a South-South-Easterly line from the North-East corner of a South-South-Easterly line from the North-East corner of Reserve 907 aforesaid, passing through the South-West corner of Williams Location 263 (McAullay's); on the South by part of an East-North-Easterly line from the South-West corner of Williams Location 126 at Tarwonga to Survey post Q 6 near Bungon Pool in the Arthur River from said post due East; on the East by the Northern portion of a South-Westerly line from Mount Glasse towards Survey post O11 near Kybelup Pool in the Pallinup River.

KATANNING ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by a North line starting from a post on the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning, passing along part of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256 and through that location's North-West corner then by the Eastern portion of a North-Easterly line extending from the 147-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road and passing through the South-East corner of Reserve 338 near Boyerine Pool; on the North by an East line passing through the North boundary of Williams Location 71 at Woolkabunning; on the South by an Easterly line from the post before mentioned at the intersection of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256 with the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning to the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 249 (Garrity's), thence due East; on the *East* by part of a North-Easterly line between Survey post O 11 near Kybelup Pool in the Pallinup River and Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range.

BROOMEHILL ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an Easterly line from a post at the intersection of the West boundary of Kojonup Location 256 with the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning, to the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 249 (Garrity's), thence due East; on the West by part of the West boundary of Location 256, extending South from the post above mentioned on the South side of the road from Kojonup to Katanning to the South-West corner of Location 256 aforesaid, thence in a South-South-Easterly direction to the centre of the Gordon River, at its inter-section with the East boundary of Reserve 875, near the Gordon Bridge; on the South by an Easterly line from the spot above mentioned on the East boundary of Reserve 875, passing through the South-West corner of Plantagenet Location 169 near Pootenup; on the South-East by a North-Easterly line passing through survey post O 11 near Ky-belup Pool, in the Pallinup River, and extending onwards in the same direction towards Mount Glasse, in the Bremer Range.

WANDERING ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the summit of Mount Dale and extending in a South-Easterly direction to a spot 20 miles East from the 41-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, thence South Easterly to Cojatotine Pool, in the Hotham River, then by the Hotham River downwards to the Perth-Albany Road, then by the East side of said road in a North-Westerly direction to a spot due East from the South-East corner of Reserve 334, then by a West line passing through the South boundary of Reserve 334 aforesaid, then by the Northern end of a North-Westerly line from the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers to the 41-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, then from said 41-mile post along the West side of said road to a spot near the old 33-mile tree, said spot being situate due East from the South boundary of Rockingham Townsite, then from said spot near the 33-mile tree on the Perth-Albany Road to the starting point on the Summit of Mount Dale.

This District also includes the Perth-Albany Road Northwards to its junction with the Perth-Bunbury Road and entirely excludes the Hotham River Bridge on the Perth-Albany Road.

ARTHUR ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the 147-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, and extending in a North-Easterly direction through the South-East corner of Reserve 338 near Boyerine Pool to a spot due West from the North boundary of Williams Location 71 at Woolkabunning, then from spot aforesaid due East to a line from Survey Post Oll near Kybelup Pool in the Pallinup River to Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range, then along line last mentioned to a spot due East from Survey Post Q6 near Bungon Pool in the Arthur River, thence West to said post Q6, thence in a West-South-Westerly direction through the South-West corner of Williams Location 126 at Tarwonga to a line from the junction of the Williams and Hotham Piracet at the investion of the Balanam and Arthur Birare. Rivers to the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers, then along said line to a spot due West from the 147-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, then from spot last mentioned to the 147-mile post previously referred to as the starting point.

WILLIAMS ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of Reserve 907 near the York Road crossing on the Hotham River, and extending in a South-South-Easterly direction through the South-West corner of Williams Location 263 (McAullay's) to a line from Survey Post Q 6 near Bungon Pool in the Arthur River, through the South-West corner of Williams Location 126 at Tarwonga, then by the Western end of said line and its prolongation in a West-South-Westerly direction to a line from the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers to the junction of the Williams and

Hotham Rivers then along said line to a spot due West from the South-West corner of Reserve 605 near Quindaning, thence East to said corner, thence North to the North-West corner of Reserve 605, thence in a North North-Easterly direction to the South-East corner of William's Location 144, then along the East side of the Perth-Albany Road, Northwards to the Hotham River, then by said River upwards to the North-East corner of Reserve 907 before mentioned as the starting point.
This District also includes the Hotham River Bridge on

the Perth-Albany Road.

KOJONUP ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the 147 mile post on the Perth-Albany Road and extending in a North-Easterly Ferth-Albany Road and extending in a North-Easterly direction towards the South-East corner of Reserve 338, near Boyerine Pool, to a spot due North from the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 256, thence South passing through the North-West corner of Location 256 aforesaid, along that Location's West boundary to its South-West corner, thence in a South South-Easterly direction to the centre of the Gordon River at its intersection with to the centre of the Gordon River at its intersection with the East boundary of Reserve 875, then by the Gordon River downwards to its junction with the Frankland River, then in a Northerly direction to a spot situate 16 miles West from the 175-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, then from spot aforesaid to the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers, then from junction last mentioned towards the junction of the Williams and Hotham Rivers to a spot due West from the 147-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, thence East to said 147-mile post before mentioned as the starting point.

PLANTAGENET ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Southward by the sea coast and the Islands adjacent thereto; on the Westward and Northward by the South-eastern shore of Nornalup Inlet and the Frankland River upwards to its junction with the Gordon Frankland River upwards to its junction with the Gordon River; then by the Gordon River upwards to its intersection with the East boundary of Reserve 875, near the Gordon Bridge, on the Perth-Albany road; thence in an Easterly direction to and beyond the South-West corner of Plantagenet Location 169, near Pootenup; then by a North-Easterly line passing through survey post O11 near Kybelup Pool, in the Pallinup River, and onwards in the same direction to Mount Glasse in the Bremer Range; from thence East-North-Easterly to a spot in longitude 124 degrees East, situate due East from the summit of Wongan Hills; thence due East on the Eastward by part of the East boundary of this Colony. NELSON ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the South-West corner of Wellington Location 171, and extending East to a spot situate due South from the South-East Corner of Wellingstuate due South from the South-East Corner of Wellington Location 40; thence North along the East boundary of said Location 40 to Gregory's marked line of road from Bunbury to Kojonup, known as the "Old Post Road"; thence by said road to the junction of the Balgarup and Arthur Rivers, thence in a South-Easterly direction to a spot situate 16 miles West from the 175-mile post on the Perth-Albany Road, thence Southerly to the junction of the Gouden and Engelbed Biggers they be the unction of the Gordon and Frankland Rivers, then by the Frankland River and the shores of Nornalup Inlet to the sea, then by the sea coast including adjacent Islands to Point D'Entrecasteaux, thence North-North-Easterly to the junction of Bullamurrup Creek with the Warren River, thence Northerly along Bullamurrup Creek and onwards to the South-West corner of Nelson Location 31 at Manjimup, thence to the junction of Padbury Brook with the Blackwood River, and thence North-Westerly to the South-West corner of Wellington Location 171, previously referred to as the starting point.

LOWER BLACKWOOD ROADS BOARD DISTRICT.

Bounded on the Northward and Westward by a Westerly line from the junction of Padbury Brook with the Black-wood River to the Western end of St. John's Bridge on the wood layer to the Western end of St. John's Bridge on the Lower Blackwood Road, thence along St. John's Brook downwards to its junction with the Blackwood River thence by the Southern side of said Blackwood River downwards to the sea; on the Eastward by a South-South-Easterly line from the junction of Padbury Brook with the Blackwood River to the South-West corner of Nelson Leontin 21 of Marylingup, these South-Bally to the Pulls Location 31 at Manjimup, thence Southerly to the Bullamurup Creek, and along said Creek downwards to its junction with the Warren River, thence South-South-Westerly to Point D'Entrecasteaux on the Southward by the sea coast and islands adjacent thereto.
