WHEREAS the Parliament of Western Australia now stands prorogued until Wednesday, the 22nd day of June: AND WHEREAS it is expedient further to prorogue the same: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Administrator, in exercise of the powers in me vested, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament from Wednesday, the 22nd day of June, to Wednesday, the 10th day of August next ensuing.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1892," that "the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare the Close Season for any particular Native Game included in the First Schedule to the said Act, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof, to be defined in

"any such Proclamation"; and also to declare "that any Bird or Animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the Colony or in any one or more portions thereof": NOW THEREFORE I, ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that within the limits of that portion of the Colony—bounded on the *West* and *South* by the Sea Coast, including the islands adjacent to it; on the *North* by the Murchison River; on the *East* by a line from Bompas Hill, in the Great Northern Bend of the Murchison River, through Wongan Hills and Mount Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River, and including a strip of land five miles wide along the South Coast and a block of land at Eucla measuring 20 miles along the Coast by 10 miles in depth—the Close Season for the following Birds, viz. :—

Wild Ducks of all species (including Musk Duck or Steamer), Teal, Emu, Wild Geese, Bustard or Wild Turkey, Swamp Hen, Bronze-winged and other Pigeons, Gnow, Quail, Rottnest and other Snipe, shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, and November.

For Swans, the Close Season shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, November, and December.

For the Booby, Frigate Bird, Noddy, Pelican, Curlew, Sea Pie, Sea Snipe, Mutton Bird, Red Bill, Cormorant or Shag, the Close Season, *North of the Moore River*, shall be for and during the mouths of June, July, August, and September.

For Seals, the Close Season shall be for and during the months of November, December, January, February, and March.

The Bittern, Magpie, Laughing Jackass, Wattle-Bird, Wag-Tail, and Robin Redbreast are declared to be *strictly preserved* throughout the Colony, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden:

AND WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," it is further provided that "the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, by like Proclamation, declare any "portion of the Colony or locality a Reserve for "Native Game": NOW THEREFORE I, the said ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, as such Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare so much of the River Swan as lies between the Bunbury Railway Bridge, at Bishop's Island, and the Narrows, at Mill Point, a Reserve for Native Game, and all shooting within such limits is strictly prohibited."

Bonus for Making Jam.

Colonial Secretary's Office,

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a bonus of £200 (two hundred pounds) for the manufacture of jam is offered by the Government to be competed for on the following conditions:—

- (1) A sum of £10 per ton will be paid to any person or company who manufactures not less than 3 tons of good marketable jam, made from fruit grown in the Colony, other than grapes, melons, pumpkins, and tomatoes.
- (2) The sum of £10 per ton shall not be paid for any quantity exceeding 20 tons in all.
- (3) Competitors to notify the Government so soon as the stipulated quantity of three tons is made.
- (4) The amount of the bonus will be paid to each applicant so soon as the Government is satisfied that the jam has been made and is in a marketable state and in good condition.
- (5) The jam to be made between the 1st November, 1891, and the 30th June, 1893.
- (6) Applications for the bonus will be decided by the Governor-in-Council, whose decision on any application or point arising shall be final.

Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

WHEREAS by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things "to prescribe the limits in or "about the mouth of or within any river, creek, "stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within "which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish "by means of any net or fixed engine, and to impose "such reasonable penalties, not exceeding £20, and "forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think "fit, for any breach of such Regulations:—

His Excellency the Administrator in Council does by this Regulation declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, within the following limits of the Swan and Canning Rivers, that is to say:—

In the Swan River.—From the Narrows, at Mill Point, in Perth Water, to the Upper Swan Bridge.

In the Canning River.—From the Lower Canning Bridge to the Upper Canning Bridge.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of £10 for a first offence and £20 for every subsequent offence, and shall forfeit the net or engine used, and all fish which he shall have taken.

THE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

JOHN FORREST,
Colonial Treasurer.

1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.

2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the

value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.

3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.

4. THIS Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1889.

CARNARVON COMMONAGE BY-LAWS.

1. That an annual sum of Ten shillings per head for horses and cattle, Three pence per head for sheep for killing purposes, One shilling per head for sheep not for killing purposes, Twenty shillings per head for pigs, Two shillings and sixpence per head for goats, shall be levied upon every owner of stock depasturing upon the Carnarvon Commonage, and shall be paid to the Carnarvon Municipal Council on the first days of January and July in each year.

2. That it shall be compulsory for every owner of stock depasturing on the Carnarvon Commonage to give to the Carnarvon Municipal Council on the 31st day of December and 30th day of June in each year a correct return of the number of horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, and other stock which he or she shall intend to depasture on the

Commonage, and obtain from the Chairman of the Municipality or person appointed by the Council a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.

3. That no person, firm, or family shall depasture on the Carnarvon Commonage a greater number of horses and cattle than twenty-five, or of sheep than twenty, except sheep for killing purposes, which shall not exceed one hundred, or of goats six.

4. That all arrears in respect of Commonage fees remaining unpaid for three months after they have become due, shall be sued for by the Council in the Local Court, and any stock in respect of which such proceedings are taken shall be liable to be seized and sold by order of the Court to satisfy such arrears and costs of suit.

5. All fees shall be for and on account of the Carnarvon Municipality.

6. That all stock depasturing on the Carnarvon Commonage, except in accordance with these By-Laws, may be treated as trespassing on the Commonage.

7. That any person or persons running stock on the Carnarvon Commonage may change them at any time, irrespective of brands, on application to the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

8. That no entire horse or bull (except the property of the Municipality) shall be allowed on the Commonage, and any such stock found shall be liable to be destroyed if not removed by the owners after they shall have had notice from the Council.

9. That the only persons exempt from these By-Laws shall be *bond fide* travellers with stock, providing that such travellers stay not more than seven days on the Commonage; also teams travelling, providing that such teams shall not stay longer than four days on the Commonage. Providing always, that such periods may be extended on application to the Council should the Council approve of such extension. And if any person shall exceed the time allowed for staying on the Commonage, the sum of three-pence per head for horses and cattle per week or part of a week for the first month, afterwards the sum of sixpence per head per week or part of a week, and for sheep one penny per head per week or part of a week shall be charged. Camels shall be allowed to stay on the Commonage forty-eight hours, and if they exceed that time two shillings per head per week or any part of a week shall be charged.

10. That it shall be compulsory for all travelling stock to depasture on the North side of the River, and West of the Telegraph line.

11. That all horses and cattle under the age of twelve months shall be exempt from the above By-Laws.

All previous By-Laws are hereby cancelled.

Ex-Seventh Standard Children in Elementary Schools.

These Regulations will come into force on the 1st January, 1893.

1. All children, who have successfully passed the Seventh Standard, may continue their studies in not more than three (3) of the following subjects:—

Drawing.

Domestic Economy (Girls).

Animal Physiology.

French.

Advanced Arithmetic (including Euclid, Book I., and the four simple Rules in Algebra).

History.

2. Girls must take Domestic Economy as one of these special subjects.
3. The Grant for a successful pass in each of these subjects will be Six Shillings (6s.) per pass.
4. Notice of the intention to teach these subjects must be given to the Inspector of Schools on or before the last day in March in each year, otherwise no examination will be held. Such notice must state the subjects chosen and the probable number of candidates.
5. No scholars can be examined for two successive years in the same subject without special permission from the Inspector of Schools.
6. COURSE OF STUDY—

(a.) *Drawing*.—Freehand (from the flat) from copies, and from the blackboard.

(b.) *Domestic Economy*.—Food: Its composition and nutritive value. The Dwelling: Cleaning and Ventilation. Rules for health.

(c.) *Animal Physiology*.—The Build of the Human Body. Names and positions of the internal organs. The organs and functions of alimentation and circulation.

(d.) *French*.—Grammar to the end of Regular Verbs. Ten pages of an easy Reading Book (a sufficient number of exercises may be substituted by permission of the Inspector).

(e.) *Advanced Arithmetic*.—Arithmetic generally. Euclid (Book I. to Prop. 26). Algebra: Notation, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, and Division.

(f.) *History*.—List of Sovereigns since Egbert, with dates of accession and death of each, and the chief events in each reign. Special knowledge of the Roman, Saxon, Danish, and Norman Conquests of England. Provisions of Magna Charta and Petition of Right, with the circumstances which led to their adoption.

STANDARDS I. AND II.—

1. Hemming, seaming, felling.
2. Any garment or other useful article showing these stitches.

STANDARDS III. AND IV.—

1. The work of the previous Standards.
2. Stitching, pleating, sewing on strings.
3. Any garment showing these stitches.
4. Herring-bone stitch in addition for Standard IV.

STANDARDS V. AND UPWARDS—

1. The work of the previous Standards.
2. Gathering, sewing-in, button-hole, sewing on button.
3. Any garment showing these stitches.
4. Patching, in calico, print, and flannel.
5. Darning stocking-web material (thin places and holes), Standards VI. and VII. only.

NOTES.

1. Each girl presented for examination for "Results" must show a finished garment suitable for her Standard. Such garment must have been worked in the 12 months preceding the Examination.
2. Garments must be presented for examination in the same condition as when completed by the Scholars.
3. At the examination for "Results," the Inspectors will give one or more of the Exercises mentioned in the Table of Exercises attached, to be worked in their presence.
4. Suitable needles, cotton, thimbles, and scissors should be in readiness for distribution, together with the other material mentioned in the Table of Exercises, so that time may not be lost at the examination.
5. Colored cottons are recommended throughout for this test examination.

GRANT TO COVER EXPENSES.

In order to cover the expenses involved by this Needlework Schedule, a grant of two shillings and sixpence for each girl passing the Needlework Examination will be allowed. This Grant will be paid in a lump sum to the Teacher.
