WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on THURSDAY, THE THIRD DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Vic., No. 12), it is, amongst other things, enacted that all vessels, as well Her Majesty's Ships of War as others, coming from or having touched at any place from which the Governor shall have adjudged and declared it probable that any infectious disease, dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought, shall, upon their arrival at any port or place in the Colony, be obliged to perform Quarantine: AND WHEREAS it has been reported to the Governor that many European and other Ports are infected with the infectious disease known as Cholera: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the infectious disease known as Cholera may be brought from all ports other than the ports of Australasia.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may declare and proclaim any town to be a Municipality, and may, by the same or any other Proclamation, define the boundaries of such Municipality and the Wards therein, and the limits of each Ward; AND WHEREAS the boundaries of the Municipality of Fremantle were defined by Proclamation dated the 20th day of February, 1871, and were, by a Proclamation dated the 6th day of October, 1886, further extended so as to unite other lands with the said Municipality; AND WHEREAS the Wards of the said Municipality were not defined by or in the said Proclamation or either of them, and have not at any time been properly defined; AND WHEREAS it is provided by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1876" (40 Vic., No. 13), that if at any time subsequent to the constituting of a Municipality the population shall exceed Five thousand, there shall be a Council consisting of a Chairman and twelve Councillors; AND WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act Amendment Act, 1892" (55 Vic., No. 16), it is further provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation to be gazetted, declare the number of the population of any Municipality as well when first proclaimed as at any subsequent period, and the number of the Members of the Council shall not be increased without such declaration; AND WHEREAS the population of Fremantle exceeds Five thousand; NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, G.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the number of the population of the Fremantle Municipality to be over and above Five thousand; AND I do also, with the like advice, hereby declare, proclaim, and define the boundaries of the said Municipality to be as follows:—

FREMANTLE PROPER.

Bounded by lines starting from the left bank of the Swan River, and extending South along the Western boundaries of Swan Locations 62 and 71, to the South-West corner of Swan Location 71, thence East along the Southern boundaries of Swan Locations 71, 139, and 650, and along part of the Southern boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 8 to an angle therein situated 15 chains 95 links East from the South-East corner of Swan Location 650, thence South 62 chains 4 links, then East 20 chains, then South passing along the Western boundaries of Cockburn Sound Locations 63 and 110 to the Northern boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 10, then West to its North-West corner, and South 19 chains 86 links along its Western boundary to the North-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 5 and West passing along the North boundary of said Location 5 to the Sea-coast, then along it Northwards and East along the said bank of the Swan River to the starting point.

NORTH FREMANTLE.

Bounded on the East by a North line of 34 chains 10 links from the North-East corner of Minim Cove; on the North by a West line to the Sea-coast; on the West by the Sea-coast Northwards from Rous' Head; and on the South-East by the right bank of the Swan River from Rous' Head to Minim Cove.

AND I DO ALSO, with the advice aforesaid, declare and proclaim that the Wards of the said Municipality shall be the North, South, East, and West Wards, and that the limits and boundaries of the

said Wards shall be and the same are hereby defined as follows:—

WEST WARD.

Bounded on the North by the shore of Swan River; on the East by Market Street and South Terrace as far as Essex Street; on the South by Essex Street; thence along the sea-shore to new jetty; and on the West by the sea-shore.

NORTH WARD (1st part).

Bounded on the West by Market Street as far as South Terrace, thence along South Terrace to Henderson Street; on the South by Henderson Street, Queen Street, and part of Hill Street until it intersects with Parry Street; on the East by Parry Street and Quarry Street to North Fremantle Bridge.

(2nd part.)

Bounded on the East by a North line of 34 chains 10 links from the North-East corner of Minim Cove; on the North by a West line to Sea-coast; on the West by the Sea-coast Northwards from Rous' Head; and on the South-East by the shore from Rous' Head to Minim Cove.

EAST WARD.

Bounded on the West by Quarry Street, Parry Street, Hill Street as far as Hampton Road, thence along Hampton Road to John Street; on the South by John Street and Broome Street; on the East by Carrington Street as far as Marmion Street; on the North by Marmion Street, thence along East Street to the Swan River, and along the river shore to the North Fremantle Bridge.

SOUTH WARD (1st part.)

Bounded on the North by the Southern boundary of the West Ward to the corner of Essex Street and the Southern boundary of the North and East Wards; on the East by Carrington Street to South Street; and on the South by South Street to the sea.

(2nd part.)

Bounded by the present South boundary of Fremantle Townsite and by a North line of 21 chains along its East boundary, thence by lines extending East along the North boundaries of Fremantle Suburban Lots 46, 47, 48, and 49, then South passing along the East boundaries of Fremantle Suburban Lots 49, 50, 57, and 58, to the North boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 10, thence West to its North-West corner, and South along its West boundary to the South-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 222; then West along the South boundaries of Cockburn Sound Locations 222, 70, and 203 to the Sea-coast, and by the Sea-coast Northward to the South boundary of Fremantle Townsite aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Section 32 of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," the Goods enumerated or described therein are prohibited to be imported or brought into Western Australia: And whereas by the said section it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time prohibit the importation of any article or goods, being a manufactured or natural product: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order that from and after the date hereof, the importation into this Colony of the undermentioned articles, by land or sea, is hereby prohibited; and if any such goods are so imported they shall be absolutely and peremptorily forfeited, as provided by the aforesaid section of the said Act:—

- Essence of Brandy.
- Essence of Geneva.
- Essence of Rum.
- Essence of Sherry.

And the Honorable Sir John Forrest, K.C.M.G., Colonial Treasurer, shall give the necessary direction herein accordingly.

The Order-in-Council dated 23rd August, 1892, is hereby rescinded.

ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.

2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum

not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.

3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.
