WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of business, on THURSDAY, THE THIRD DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

IN pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the fiftieth year of Our Lady the Queen, and intituled "An Act for the Management of Goldfields," I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the portion of Crown Lands, bounded on the North and West by lines extending East two hundred and fifty miles and South one hundred and eighty miles from a point situate eighty miles North and twenty miles West from Ennuin Well, the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal, to be a Goldfield, and to be known and called by the name of "The Yilgarn Goldfield," excluding all lands alienated from the Crown, and also the lands comprised within the townsites of Southern Cross and Knutsford within the aforesaid boundaries.

The Proclamation of 22nd November, 1888, is hereby cancelled from this date.

WHEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," and "The Prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock Act, 1879," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected, for the purposes of the said Acts; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station for Dogs at the Abrolhos: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a temporary Quarantine Station, Gun Island, one of the group of Houtman's Abrolhos, for the purposes of the said Acts, for a period not to exceed seven months from this date.

WHEREAS by "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868" (32 Vic., No. 12), it is, amongst other things, enacted that all vessels, as well Her Majesty's Ships of War as others, coming from or having touched at any place from which the Governor shall have adjudged and declared it probable that any infectious disease, dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought, shall, upon their arrival at any port or place in the Colony, be obliged to perform Quarantine: AND WHEREAS it has been reported to the Governor that many European and other Ports are infected with the infectious disease known as Cholera: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby adjudge and declare it probable that the infectious disease known as Cholera may be brought from all ports other than the ports of Australasia.




