HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, SIR WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested as aforesaid, and of all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that THE THIRD SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, shall be holden, for the despatch of busi-ness, on THURSDAY, THE THIRD DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Logislative Council Chambers in St. Council the Legislative Council Chambers, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony ; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chambers, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

#### NORTH FREMANTLE BRIDGE.

**P.W.**  $\frac{3800}{92}$ .

SPECIAL Regulations for the management and use of the North Fremantle Bridge, framed by the Governor in Executive Council on the 18th of October, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878" (42 Vic., No. 18):—

1. All Special Regulations heretofore made for the management and use of the North Fremantle Bridge are altered and cancelled from this date.

2. No person shall drive, or cause to be driven, any vehicle containing a load exceeding 25 cwt. on to or across the Bridge.

3. No animal or vehicle shall be ridden or driven on to or across the Bridge at other than a walking pace.

4. No cattle, camels, or horses shall be driven on to or across the Bridge between the months of April and September (both inclusive) except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 7.30 a.m., or between the months of October and March (both inclusive) except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 6 a.m., unless the same shall be harnessed to some vehicle.

5. All persons in charge of or driving cattle, camels, or horses on to or across the Bridge shall place a person at the opposite end of the Bridge to caution other persons against crossing during the transit of such cattle, camels, or horses.

#### NOTICE.

Every person violating the above Regulations shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ . (42 Vic., No. 18, Sec. 3.)

The Flour to be warranted to keep good for six months after delivery.

Fresh meat to be delivered daily, and in proportion of three days' supply of Mutton to four days' supply of Beef per week, or alternate days of each. When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be exclusive of heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints. Prime joints only to be supplied to hospitals, and chops and rump steak as required.

The ordinary ration of Vegetables to consist of 1lb. of Potatoes; but when demanded by the Government, and in season, the following equivalents must be supplied twice a week: Pumpkins, 2lbs.; or Turnips, Carrots, or Cabbage, 12b.; or Onions, 4b., for every pound of Potatoes.
