### NORTH FREMANTLE BRIDGE.

P.W. <sup>3890</sup>

SPECIAL Regulations for the management and use of the North Fremantle Bridge, framed by the Governor in Executive Council on the 18th of October, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878" (42 Vic., No. 18) :—

1. All Special Regulations heretofore made for the management and use of the North Fremantle Bridge are altered and cancelled from this date.

2. No person shall drive, or cause to be driven, any vehicle containing a load exceeding 25 cwt. on to or across the Bridge.

3. No animal or vehicle shall be ridden or driven on to or across the Bridge at other than a walking pace.

4. No cattle, camels, or horses shall be driven on to or across the Bridge between the months of April and September (both inclusive) except between the hours of 5 a.m. and 7:30 a.m., or between the months of October and March (both inclusive) except between the hours of 4 a.m. and 6 a.m., unless the same shall be harnessed to some vehicle.

5. All persons in charge of or driving cattle, camels, or horses on to or across the Bridge shall place a person at the opposite end of the Bridge to caution other persons against crossing during the transit of such cattle, camels, or horses.

### NOTICE.

Every person violating the above Regulations shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20. (42 Vic., No. 18, Sec. 3.)

When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be exclusive of heads,

The Government does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender for any of the above-named services, and reserves to itself the right of accepting a portion of a tender.

The supplies to be delivered at such places and times as may be required by the Government or person deputed by it.

The Contractors will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

Payments to be made monthly, and for general supplies for the quantities actually consumed in the month.

No transfer of any Contract will be permitted, without the *previous consent* of the Government.

Each Tender must bear the *bonâ fide signatures* of two responsible and approved sureties, who will be required to be bound for the due performance of the Contract, under a penalty of about one-fourth of the estimated sum to be paid under each contract. Parties are requested to be careful in drawing up their Tenders, which should be in strict conformity with this Notice.

Forms of Tender may be had on application to the various Resident Magistrates, and at the Public Offices, Perth; and no tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

From the Post Office at Serpentine to Mr. A. R. Richardson's (Lowlands), and *vice versâ*, calling at the various homesteads *en route* on both sides of the river, twice a week, on horseback.

26. *Roebourne-Bamboo Creek.*

From Roebourne to Bamboo Creek, and *vice versâ*, *viâ* Messrs. Fisher's, Meares', Withnell's, Mallina, McKay's, Wellard's, DeGrey, and Marble Bar, once every four weeks, on horseback.

27. *Vasse-Lockeville.*

From the Vasse Post Office to the Post Office at Lockeville, and *vice versâ*, twice a week, on horseback.

28. *York-Railway Station.*

From the York Post Office to the Railway Station, and *vice versâ*, daily, as often as required, in a spring vehicle.


